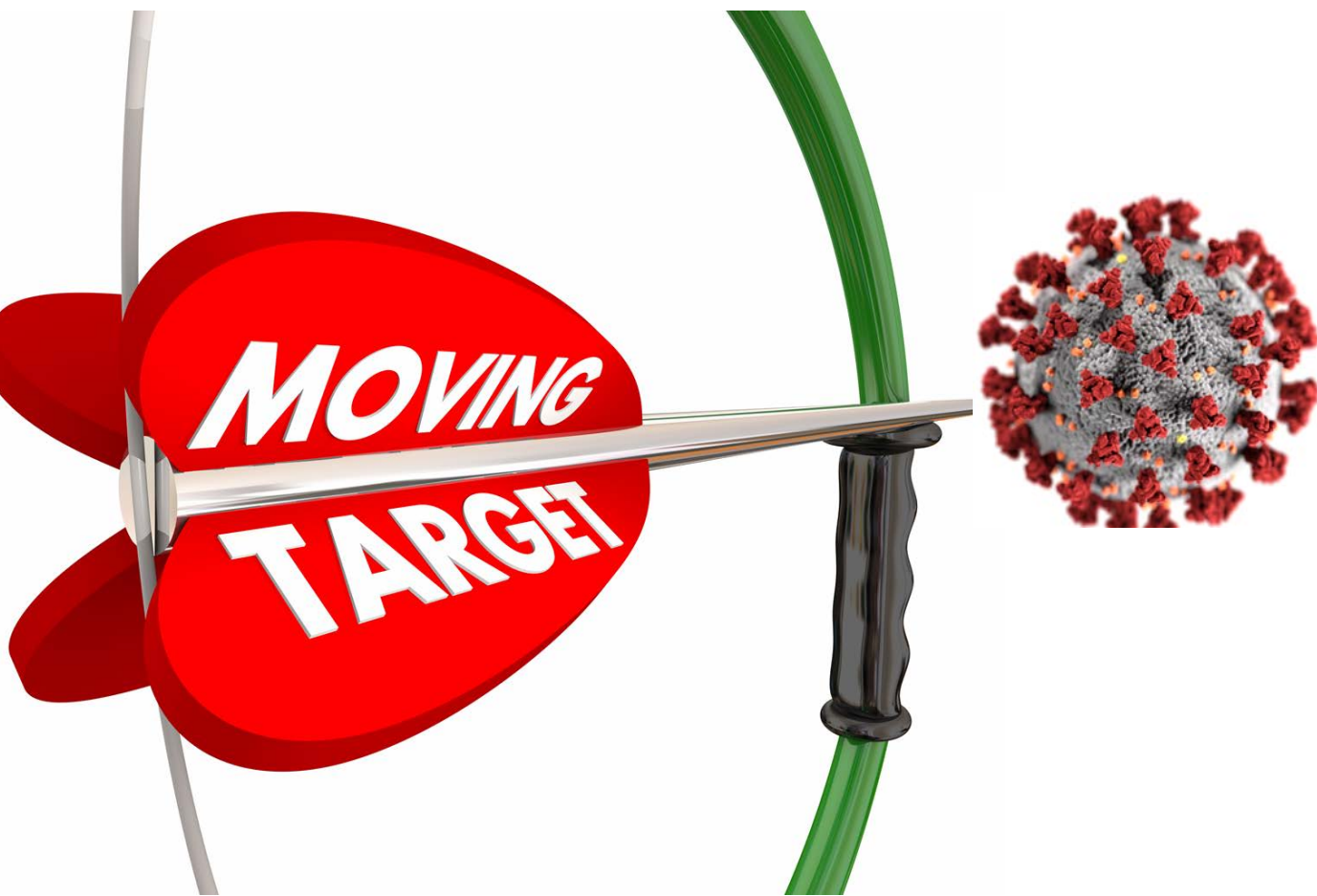

How will we know when its safe to return?

Analysis of data from Oakland & Wayne counties, specifically City of Oak Park, City of Detroit & Wayne County.

Informed decisions based on bi-weekly conferences with the OCHD Epidemiologist, Lead Nurse, district RN & assigned nurses.

Monitoring trends in local, state & international data.

The Oakland Country recommendation for in-person instruction is a Level C or higher.

Survey data from parents, students & staff.

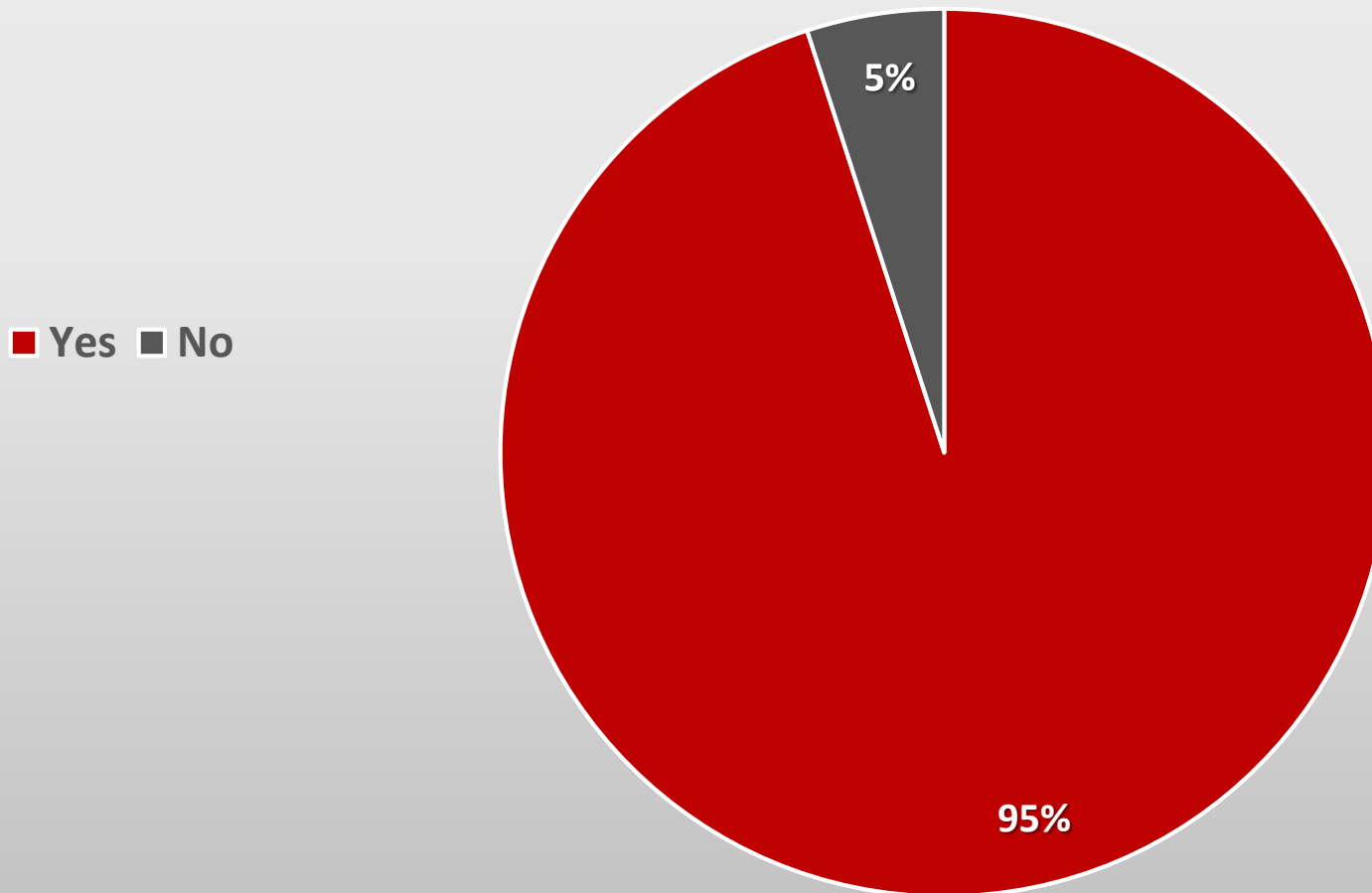
County Risk Level | Phased Re-Entry Crosswalk

Metrics	Oakland County Health Risk Level	Phased Re-Entry to In-Person Instruction
7 to <20 cases per million; 3 to <7% percent positivity	A	OPS <i>will</i> operate on an abbreviated schedule based on consultation with the District RN, OCHD, and other local health conditions, if the in-person student population/preference exceeds 33%. Online option available. All staff are required to report.
20 to <40 cases per million; 7 to <10% percent positivity	B	OPS <i>may</i> operate on an abbreviated schedule based on consultation with the District RN, OCHD, and other local health conditions, if the in-person student population/preference exceeds 33%. Online option available. All staff are required to report.
40 to <70 cases per million; 10 to <15% percent positivity	C	OPS <i>may</i> begin the phased re-entry based on consultation with the District RN, OCHD, and other local health conditions, if the in-person student population/preference exceeds 33%. Online option available. All staff are required to report.
70 to <150 cases per million; 15 to <20% percent positivity	D	OPS <i>will</i> be engaged in fully remote/online learning with the exception of center-based programs for students with IEPs. Staff <i>may</i> work in buildings.
150 or greater cases per million; 20 or greater percent positivity	E	OPS <i>will</i> be engaged in fully remote/online learning with the exception of center-based programs for students with IEPs. Essential employees may only work in buildings, if work is not feasible to complete remotely.
411 cases per million	Currently, our positivity rate is more than 2.5X higher than the rate recommended for returning to in-person instruction.	OPS <i>will</i> be engaged in fully remote/online learning with the exception of center-based programs for students with IEPs. Essential employees may only work in buildings, if work is not feasible to complete remotely.

NOTE: Level C must be reached to consider a phased re-entry. Level C is consistent with neighboring district goals.
 OCHD expects a 2-week trend prior to a letter status change.

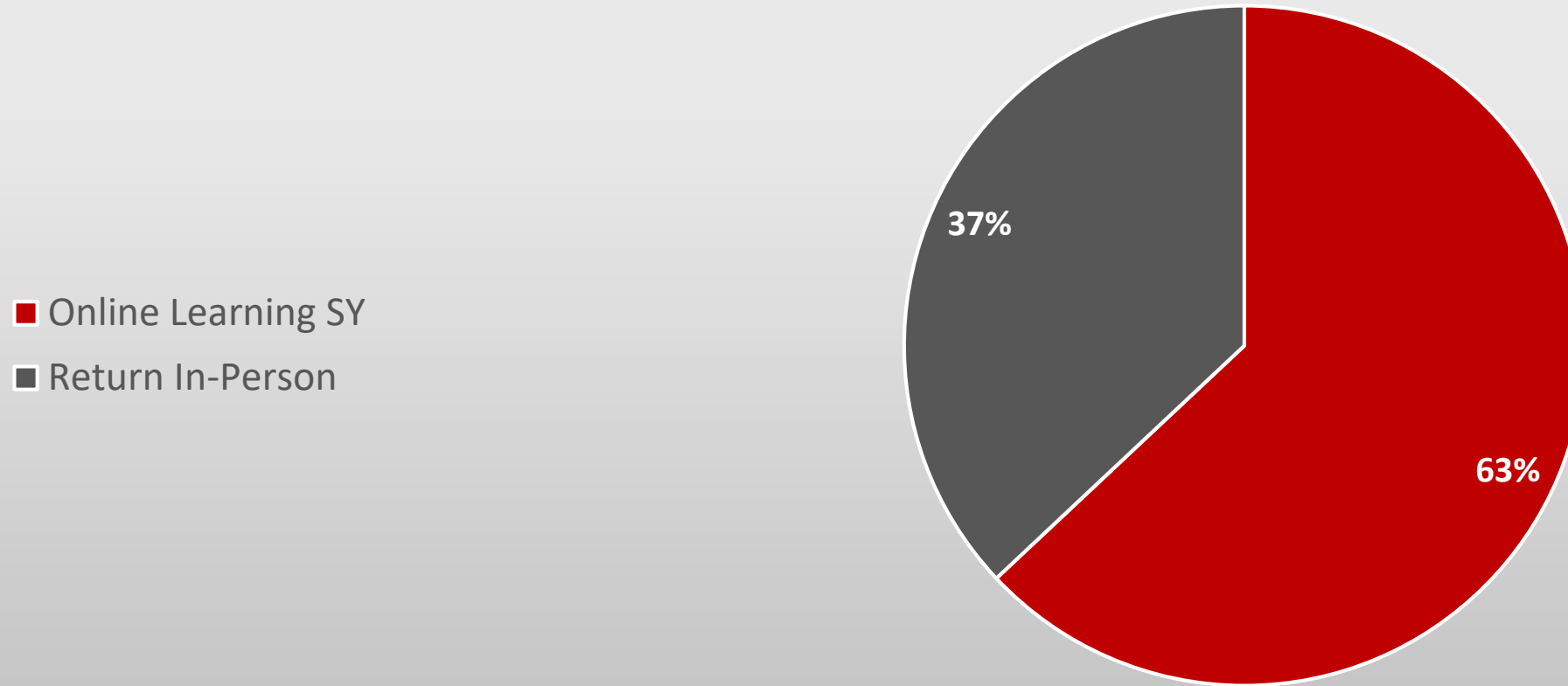
Teaching & Learning Council Survey Results

Most Recent Parent Survey Results

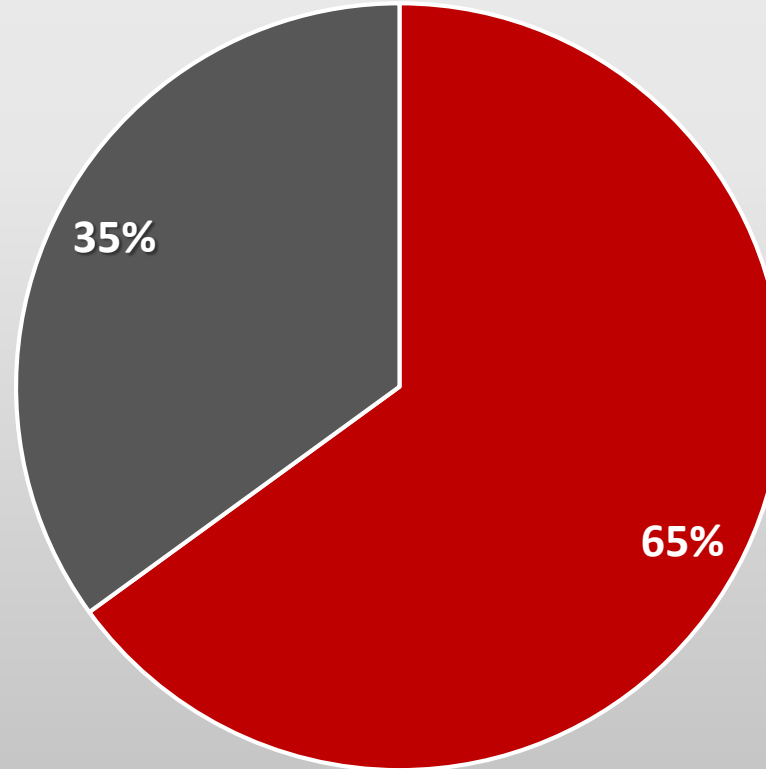

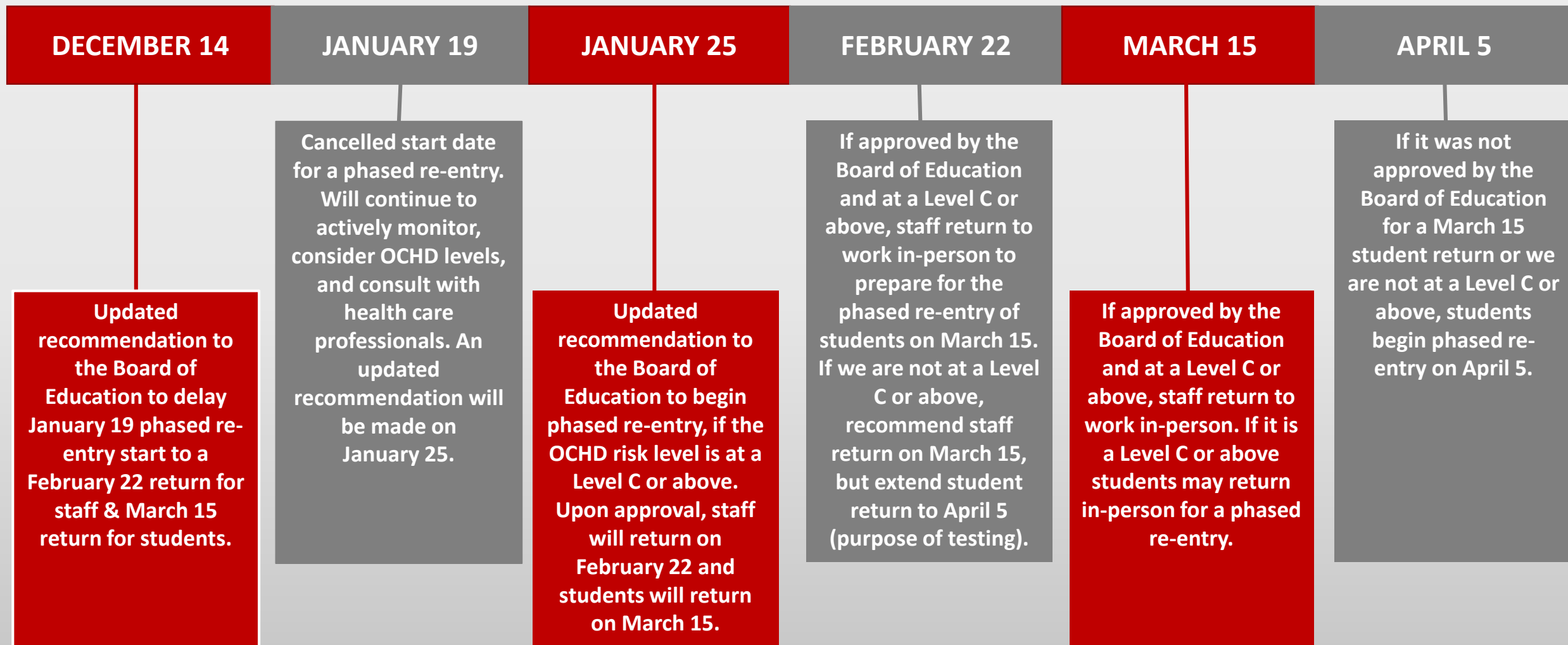
Teaching & Learning Council Survey Results
