Cocurricular/Extracurricular Activities

District high school students are encouraged to take the fullest advantage of extracurricular and cocurricular programs. In accordance with governing associations, leagues, etc., there may be restrictions, academic and otherwise, that the district and its students must honor. The district shall adopt rules and procedures to see that this is done. As a further safeguard rules and procedures will be adopted to ensure that such activities will not jeopardize the students' graduation or take precedence over the rational pursuit of that goals.

Cocurricular and extracurricular activities are considered to be any activity such as student government, contests, athletics and clubs. Participants in these activities will be subject to the basic rules pertaining to cocurricular and extracurricular activities, and the district's student activities code of conduct.

These rules are to be followed and enforced by activity coaches or advisors. Offenses will be handled by district approved procedures.

Students who represent the school in voluntary activities may be required to conform to dress and grooming standards approved by the superintendent and may be denied the opportunity to participate if those standards are not met.

Activity advisors or coaches who issue any additional rules for individual activities are subject to superintendent or designee approval prior to the activity.
