The Middle Way Parenting Program is a communication-based, interactive program that supports the development of healthy family relationships and teaches compassionate assertiveness, empathetic/active listening, empowerment and other skills to strengthen family relationships. By fostering these skills, the Middle Way Parenting Program works to prevent future abuse within the home. For 8 weeks, 1 1/2 hours per week, participants engage in an introspective process of positive personal change. Through a collaborative agreement, Family Service will provide expertise and management of the program, recruitment and implementations of the Middle Way Curriculum from September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2018.

**Family Service:** will be responsible to provide the following tasks:

1. Provide administrative oversight, overall coordination and implementation of the parent group trainings.
2. Provide appropriate and required documentation of program activities and number of parents served: informational flyers, sign-in sheets, agendas, hand outs and program surveys
3. Provide assistance in tracking and reviewing outcomes for the purpose of future program development and growth
4. Provide certificates of completion/participation to all participants.
5. Provide programmatic items needed for implementation of trainings
