Physical Plant and Equipment Levy Renewal

Background:

The Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) may be used for the following purposes:

- purchase and improvement of grounds;
- construction of schoolhouses or buildings and opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings;
- purchase, lease, or lease-purchase of equipment or technology exceeding \$500 per transaction;
- payment of debts contracted for the erection or construction of schoolhouses or buildings, not including interest on bonds;
- procuring or acquisition of library facilities;
- repairing, remodeling, reconstructing, improving, or expanding the schoolhouses or buildings and additions to existing schoolhouses;
- expenditures for energy conservation;
- rental of facilities;
- purchase of transportation equipment for transporting students;
- purchase or lease-purchase of school buildings; equipment purchases for recreational purposes; and
- demolition, clean-up, and other costs incurred within two years of a natural disaster.

A voted PPEL may be authorized for a period not exceeding ten years and in an amount not exceeding \$1.34 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation.

Our ten-year Belmond-Klemme voted PPEL is for \$0.67 and expires in 2025.

Review of Research:

Most area schools levy \$0.67 or more for their voted PPEL. The mean PPEL levy among area schools is \$0.87. The median is \$0.77. See the table below.
