Food Service Building Report

The summer food service program has been very busy with community events. The food service program provided meals to approved sites/events other than our regular sites. The sites included were; Youth Day (July 10th) and NAID Celebration (July 10th & 11th). The food service program had the assistance with the vision workers at each site including the community events.

The summer food service program fed **426** kids at the Youth Day, **244** at NAID Celebration July 11th, **155** at NAID Celebration July 12th with an *overall of 825 ct*. These numbers exceeded 2023 counts at the events. Youth Day 2023 count was 358, NAID Celebration 2023 counts with 2 days combined was 159 with *overall 517* ct. This year we were in a new location and closer to the museum/carnival area which made it easier to feed the kids at the NAID. The Museum staff placed the food truck in a very nice/safe area with grass.

The food service summer program was approved for new serving times after summer school was over. The changed timers were approved through Office of Public Instruction – Summer Food Service Program with 30 minutes change in times to accommodate the kids. Flyers for changes were handed out at the recent events, posted throughout the community, and posted on Browning Public Schools FB page.

The non-congregate sites (food truck & mobile bus) have been doing an amazing job at reaching the kids that are unable to make it to the school sites. They have been moving around more rather just sitting in one spot at each site (low rent, old low rent, starr school) and when the count is low at each site, the bus will go around to mountain view, country estates, and college row). The mobile bus was also able to feed kids at a Youth Camp at Starr School (The Way).

The food service program is looking for more ways and new sites to reach the kids in the community. The staff are doing an amazing job and get the kids fed. The staff were cooking/serving kids in 100 degree weather at the recent events with the assistance of the vision workers.

The Ware house has been working very hard daily to carry out their daily operations including the assistance they provide for the school kitchens, food deliveries, and mail. We had a warehouse clerk out of work due to medical recently, but will return August 5th. The vision workers are going to assist the warehouse staff in cleaning/sorting the warehouse to prepare for the upcoming move to the new building soon.

At this time, the copy center clerk is starting to prepare for the upcoming school year, and getting orders complete.

The equipment for the Napi kitchen is in the process of getting ordered, we are waiting for an invoice from the J&V Restaurant/ supply. At this time, maintenance is looking into a temporary solution for the Napi kitchen and we may be able to use Vina's steam table until the new equipment arrives which can be 20 weeks out?
