## **CLAIM Board Member Survey Results**

Part 1: Based on Board member feedback, the following prioritized items make-up the CLAIM legislative agenda:

- 1. Monitor and prevent changes to the PTELL EAV Adjustment) that would reduce significantly (\$1M-\$6M) District 97 General State Aid (GSA)
- 2. Promoting data accessibility / sharing across districts and beyond high school
- 3. Promote legislation that requires the state to either make payments timely or pay interest
- 4. Funding for KIDS (Kindergarten Individual Development Survey) Pilot and Implementation
- 5. Encourage state funding levels be set six months prior to start of the school year (currently they are set 11-15 months AFTER the start of the school year)
- 6. Mandate requiring General Assembly to make its full contribution to TRS
- 7. Encourage the move to a foundation level for GSA be based on costs not on available monies
- 8. Funding for Pre-K students whose assessment recommends intervention

- Review D97 Board legislative agenda priorities and balance the agenda offense vs. defense, long-term vs. short-term, and D97 specific vs. state-wide
- Develop an understanding of:
  - 1. The legislative calendar and its impact on the CLAIM calendar
  - 2. The D97 budget and related issues such as RIF timelines
- Develop outreach strategies/schedule to with:
  - 1. Our local and state legislators
  - Organizations such as: ED-RED, P-20, LWV, Advance Illinois, Stand for Children, Tax and Budget Accountability
