

## What is the World's Best Workforce (WBWF)?


- Established by Minnesota State Statute 120B.11.
- The School District develops and the School Board approves a plan to support and improve teaching and learning that is aligned to the World's Best Workforce.
- The WBWF plan addresses the five WBWF goals related to school readiness, literacy, achievement gap closure, graduation, and college and career readiness.









# SCHOOL READINESS

#### **PAST**

During the 2017-2018 school year, our district has 37% of children screened between their third and fourth birthday. Our district will increase the percent of children screened between their third and fourth birthday to 40% during the 2018-2019 school year.

2018-2019

42% of children screened between 3rd & 4th birthday



#### 2019-20 School Readiness Goal

#### **FUTURE**

During the 2018-2019 school year, our district had 84% of children screened between their third through fifth birthday. Our district will increase the percent of children screened between their third through fifth birthday to 87% during the 2019-2020 school year.




# READING BY THIRD GRADE

#### **PAST**

Goal: The percentage of all students in grade 3 at OHA who meet or exceed on the MCA-III in Reading will increase from 64.5% in 2018 to 67.5% in 2019.

Key Focus Areas: Consistent teaching of small group phonemic awareness, phonics, and word work.





## 2019-20 Reading by Third-Grade

#### **FUTURE**

Goal: The percentage of all students in grade 3 at OHA who meet or exceed on the MCA-III in Reading will increase from 73.4% in 2019 to 76.4% in 2020.

Key Focus Areas: Using data to identify targeted instruction for individual students and small groups



## CLOSING THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP


### PAST

Goal: The proficiency gap between students who receive Free/Reduced Price Lunch (FRPL) and those who do not in grades 3-8 and 11th on the MCA-III in Math will decrease from 26.7% in 2018 to 23.7% in 2019.

Key Focus Areas: Continue the work on Complex Instruction, Math Talks, and Rich Math Tasks K-12.



## 2019-20 Closing the Achievement Gap Goal

#### **FUTURE**

Goal: The proficiency gap between the students who receive FRPL and those who do not in grades 3-8 and 11th on the MCA-III in Math will decrease from 27.8% in 2019 to 24.8% in 2020.

Key Focus Areas: Differentiated instruction for increased rigor for all students K-5; Vertical PLC collaboration across buildings to increase understanding of student needs; Trauma informed teaching strategies.



# **GRADUATION RATE**

### **PAST**

Goal: The percentage of students who graduate in 7 years will increase from 98.25% in 2017 (2014 cohort of 4-year graduates) to 100% in 2019.

### 2019-20 Graduation Rate Goal

#### **FUTURE**


Goal: The percentage of students who graduate in 7 years will increase from 99.6% in 2018 (2015 cohort of 4-year graduates) to 100% in 2020.

Key Focus Areas: Zephyr Wellness Initiative, Districtwide outreach, social-emotional learning.



# CAREER & COLLEGE READINESS

The percentage of 11th graders who met all three Century College Benchmark scores (Reading, Math, Science) on the ACT will increase from 65.02% in 2018 to 68.02% in 2019.





## 2019-20 Career & College Readiness Goal

The percent of 11th graders who met all three course placement measures and minimum scores for college level placements from Minnesota State (MNSCU) on the District-Administered 11th grade ACT will increase from 55.8% in 2019 to 58.8% in 2020.



## What is the Achievement and Integration Program?

- Funding established by MN Statute sections 124D.861, 124D.862, MN Rules 3535.0100-01880
- District plan reviewed every 3 years, new plan in 2020
- ISD 832 is eligible for funding because we are in a collaboration with a racially isolated district, ISD 622 North Saint Paul-Maplewood-Oakdale

#### Racially isolated:


When a district and one of its adjoining districts have a 20 percent or higher differential in the number of enrolled protected students. The district with the higher percentage is considered racially isolated.



By June 2020 the district will:

Reduce it's proficiency gap between white and nonwhite students on the MCA III reading scores from 12.8% to 10% or less.

- 17.3% in 2018
- 11.95% in 2019






By June 2020 the district will:

Reduce it's proficiency gap between those **third grade** students qualifying for free/reduced priced lunch, and those not qualifying, on the MCA III Reading scores from 50% in 2017 to 5% or less.

- 29.3% in 2018
- 25.7% in 2019





By June 2020 the district will:

Reduce the number of 9th grade students responding "disagree" or "strongly disagree" on the Minnesota Student Survey to the question "Most teachers are interested in me as a person" from 31.1% to 15% or less.

34.5% in 2019 (survey given every 3 years)
