SWIMMING/P.E. GRADE

NCRD/Nehalem Elementary School Swim Lessons are a unique and extraordinary privilege. In this area surrounded by water and dominated by water-related recreation, the swim program's goal is to provide a safe environment in which the students can learn to swim and be educated in water safety while instilling the value of swimming as a lifetime skill and healthy recreation activity. The only reason for students not participating in swim class would be due to health reasons such as: vomiting, diarrhea, skin rash (allergy, ring worm) etc. or doctor's note specifying that your child cannot swim. Please encourage your child to come to school on swim day prepared with swimsuit, towel and positive attitude for learning new skills, reviewing old ones, and having fun! Weekly swim class is now part of the P.E. grade so swimming each week isn't an extra activity; it is part of the P.E. curriculum and will be figured into the overall P.E. grade for each report card. Mix It Up at Lunch Day

<u>Super Seagulls</u>, get ready to shut down cliques and have a great time doing it and get

ready to make new friends and have some serious fun when we Mix It Up at Lunch.

It's a simple call to action: take a new seat in the cafeteria. By taking a risk, this one day, students can cross the lines of division in a safe, controlled environment, meet new people, and help build an inclusive and welcoming school community.

Teaching Tolerance, a project of the Southern Poverty Law Center, launched the Mix It Up program in 2002.

Can Mix It Up at Lunch Day really help my school?

Research shows that Mix It Up programming works. According to Mix Day organizers who responded to a 2008 survey conducted by Quality Education Data, the Mix It Up program produces powerful results:

- 97% said students' interactions were positive during Mix It Up at Lunch Day.
- 95% said Mix It Up at Lunch Day prompted students to interact with people outside their normal social circles.
- 92% said Mix It Up at Lunch Day increased awareness about social boundaries and divisions within school.
- 83% said the event helped students make new friends.
- 79% said as a result of the Day students have heightened sensitivity towards tolerance and social justice issues.
- 78% said as a result of the Day students seem more comfortable inter-
