
- Focus on one resolution or goal

WHAT... is Oregon Promise?

Oregon Promise is a state grant that covers some or all tuition at any Oregon community college for recent high school graduates and GED® recipients.

WHO... can apply?



Be a recent Oregon high school graduate or GED* recipient



Enroll in an Oregon community college within 6 months of graduation



GPA or higher



Have a 2.5 cumulative Be an Oregon resident at least 12 months prior to enrollment

WHEN... do I apply for Oregon Promise?

Term you plan to start at an Oregon community college		SPRING 2017 Begins April 3, 2017	FALL 2017 Funding subject to legislative approval
Must graduate high school between the following dates	July 1, 2016 to December 1, 2016	October 1, 2016 to March 1, 2017	March 1, 2017 to August 1, 2017
