Specifics in the shop

<u>Collision/Damage repair:</u> replacing cracked bumpers, tailgates, radiators, etc. fixing whatever is broken. Anything that gets broken in the process, gets written down so the shop can order new parts. Like a fender, bumper, side badges, any of that nature

Painting/Buffing: focuses on painting the new parts of the car that came in, parts have to be painted the exact code of paint as the customer's vehicle. Buffing is for getting scratches and damages paint out. This process takes a thin layer of paint with it as well.

Things I learned/did

Most bolts on the car will have the same size socket, and the outer liner of the wheel well has tiny screws or clips holding that plastic together.

Taking the front and back bumper off of a chevy equinox, and most of the interior panels inside the car. That was a job for sure.

Watching the painting and buffing process was also very cool to me, Mikey from Falk Auto Body just makes it look very poetic.

Highlights from my intern experience

Building relationships with the workers and bonding over something you're both passionate about.

Talking about what got them into the industry, and what they have planned for their next project car.

Being able to see first hand the insides of the engine, like the valves, crankshaft, camshaft, oil rings, the different sensors on the engine, etc.

Surprises in automotive

How well paid the workers in this industry are. Going to school for automotive tech can put you in a position to make six figures for yearly salary depending on the auto place.

How happy the staff/people are to be there everyday, knowing they helped someone in their community get back on the road. Something that I love doing, I've always wanted a job where I can help people and this seems to be just that.

Things I would've changed before
