4th grade Social Studies:

5th grade ELAR:

We are also working rigorously for the upcoming STAAR test, learning new vocabulary and benchmarking. 5th grade Math:

We are on the final countdown to testing. We will conclude our studies with 2-dimensional and 3-dimensional study of shapes! We will have a 10-day STAAR ATTACK leading up to STAAR. Tutoring groups are being reevaluated based on our benchmark test take February 26, 2019.

5th grade Science:

For 5th Grade Science, the students are studying how energy moves through the ecosystems through food webs and food chains. The

students have started preparing for the Science STAAR Test through filling out and studying review sheets. They also will be studying vocabulary words on Quizlet.com and have friendly competitions on Kahoot.com and Jeopardy while answering STAAR related questions.

8th grade Science:

8th grade students began studying the Universe. They were asked to draw what the universe looked like. We have very creative students at CMS!!



Seventh Grade Science:

Seventh grade is studying the different biomes of the world. They will be decorating boxes to model the different plants and animals that live in the world's regions.

The end of the semester is just around the corner. I find it hard to believe we will be out in a few days for Spring Break. After that we will be celebrating the end of the year before we know it.

The middle school teachers and students have been really working hard and preparing for the testing that is just around the bend. We had our first Boot Camp Day on the 25th of February.
