January 13^{th} – February 5^{th} : ACT Test Prep classes available for all students wanting to improve their ACT test scores or just be better prepared to take the ACT test the first time. January 15th ASVAB Test at HHS: Approximately 25 students took the ASVAB test on Thursday January 15, 2015. The students were tested from 8 am to 11:15 am. The ASVAB

(Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) is one of the most widely used, multiple-aptitude tests in the world, developed and maintained by the Department of Defense. More than half of all high schools nationwide administer the ASVAB test to students in grades 10, 11 and 12 (sophomores cannot use their scores for enlistment eligibility).

January 16th Teacher In-service: January 16th was one of the best teacher in-service days that I have experienced. Twenty two very talented educators gave one or more forty minute presentations on their best practices in their classrooms. Five of these presenters were from the HS. Matt Holtry talked about, the key to success, and grit and growth mindset. Casey Grove helped teachers build a web-site. Mark Thatcher explained how using chrome books and Quia.com in the classroom improved student performance in his classes. Mike Greeley shared the importance of building relationships in the classroom and how that influences student engagement. Alex Willson shared about using chrome books and google classroom in his English classes. All of the teachers from the high school, middle school and elementary school did a great job at presenting.

January 26th HHS Parent Night (FAFSA): The evening started at 6:00 p.m. in the HS library/media center, Go On & Gear Up hosted the FAFSA information Parent Night for seniors/juniors and their parents.
