As a guided exercise, students were asked what a school climate was and how they can improve their schools climate in areas of:

In reflection of the vision, the students discussed what is and is not currently happening within the schools that could improve. 


## Project Empowerment Planning

- Valuing each other's time
- Speak with care for others
- Safe space for meaningful conversations

As the students developed their leadership and student voice, they participated in a variety of breakout sessions and icebreakers.

Sessions included:

- Youth on a panel
- Youth on Boards
- Painting and Reflection on Leadership / Social Media/Phone Use Policies
- Dance and Drumming Share Out
- Self-Care for Leaders
- Finding your Future
- Art for Social Change

Other activities were also provided for students like NYO Nights with Nick Hanson and Karaoke. Our Board was able to arrange an activity night with students where we participated in Escape Rooms.
