National Center for Educational Achievement 2009 Just for the Kids Awards

The National Center for Education Achievement (NCEA) recognized these six Keller ISD schools as part of its 2009 Just of the Kids Campaign for High Performing Schools in Texas. The NCEA used two measures in the analysis for this recognition: (1) growth and (2) college and career readiness (CCR). Schools recognized for growth achieved better improvement rates for their students compared with other schools with similar demographics. Schools recognized for CCR are the top five percent of schools in the state, based on the percentage of students scoring at or above NCEA's College and Career Readiness Targets.
