Emotionally Impaired Program

El Aide (Karlie Midtgard) continues to provide direct support to Davis Middle School. She has helped to add details to the universal behavior support to help an individual student be successful. She has had great success in helping the Davis staff implement several suggestions that were given to them from the spec ed supervisor 2 week visit, including a basic behavior protocol for all students. Karlie is beginning to fade away her service currently while training a Davis aide. She will be done at Davis and back to the El program by March 25th. Supervisor will continue to follow up with Barb Wheeler at Davis to help with any possible issues in implementation once the El staff has left.

Currently all students enrolled in the HCISD EI program are in general education classes 80% or more of the day with an exception of 1 new student that has been at the program for 3 days.

We had a fun and successful celebration day combined with the elementary MOCI program. We met at Greenfield and watched a movie and played some games along

with some student from Hillsdale College. We then went bowling and had pizza in the afternoon. It was a great way to show the students some enjoying activities within the community. All students and staff seemed to have a great time.
