BACKGROUND/RATIONALE:

The goal for the proposed Title V project is to increase the completion, persistence and transfer rates of students, particularly Hispanic students and First Time in College (FTIC) students, through the creation of a Career and Transfer Center. The Center will include a career-themed summer bridge program focusing on goal formulation, career choice, and financial literacy. (CPP 2). Additional components include proactive advisement, career exploration, alternative pathways, and internship/apprenticeship opportunities. (CPP 1). A virtual online presence for the services offered at the Center will be created.
