Food Donation	The Superintendent shall be authorized to develop regulations for the District to donate or otherwise dispose of leftover food in ac- cordance with law.
Meal Charges	As established by the Board, a student with an exhausted or insuf-
State Law	ficient balance on his or her meal card or meal account shall be al- lowed to continue to purchase meals for up to a total of \$50 for an unlimited time. The Superintendent shall develop administrative regulations for this grace period to address:
	<ol> <li>The District's processes for parent notification during the grace period, including a schedule for repayment; and</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Whether the student will be limited to certain foods or bever- ages during this grace period, and, if so, the District's efforts to minimize overt identification of the student.</li> </ol>
	No fees or interest shall be charged by the District for meals pur- chased during the grace period.
Federal Law	For each campus that participates in the federal school breakfast or lunch programs under which students may incur a meal charge, the District's administrative regulations shall also address proce- dures for a student who has insufficient funds to purchase a meal following exhaustion of the grace period described above. The pro- cedures shall address:
	<ol> <li>The parameters under which meals shall be served to the stu- dent;</li> </ol>
	2. The District's efforts to minimize overt identification of the stu- dent; and
	<ol> <li>How the District will attempt to collect unpaid debt in order to maintain the financial integrity of the food service account.</li> </ol>
