Positive Behavior Taught At Williams, Fire Drill Conducted

Each of our students participated in the PBIS Rodeo yesterday. The day started in the gym, where a PBIS assembly was held to teach students about rewards that can be realized through positive behavior. The assembly included a quick game of Simon Says, as well as a skit put on by office manager Mindi Gallegos, who played a cowgirl too busy on the phone to attend to students. Ultimately good wins over bad when Gallegos rewards each of their students who present a winning ticket.

Teachers led their students to each of the "stations" where students learned the safe, respectful, and responsible behaviors for each of the places they frequent at school. Classroom aides presented at each station, and quizzed students about ways in which they can behave positively at those places.

Some students were asked to act out positive behaviors (and other behaviors) at the stations, which invariably evoked laughter from classmates and teachers alike!

The "Rodeo" is the way in which our school provides a baseline understanding for students and adults alike about what is appropriate and positive behavior at Williams Elementary.

Staff Collaborates to Incorporate New Curriculum for English Language Arts

New "non-negotiables" for time spent in the teaching and learning of English Language Arts (ELA) at the elementary level required SOME re-configuration of school academic schedules, and consequently, changes for educational assistants as well.

Members of the teaching staff at Williams, Kathy Agnifili, Cassie Elston-Bingham and Joanne Wardle collaborated to ensure fidelity to the district-wide cause of providing more ELA instruction to our students.

"Journeys" ELA Curriculum Draws Kudos from Teachers

The new Houghton Mifflin Harcourt "Journeys" English Language Arts curriculum is a positive addition to Williams School.

Initial Dibels Testing Complete at Williams

Dibels reading assessment for each student has been completed at Williams. "Data Cards" will be created for each student so teachers are able to monitor individual progress. Cards for each student are either red, yellow, or green, depending upon student reading level. During data meetings, teachers can easily and quickly refer to the cards to create reading group and discuss individual student achievement.

Partnership with Sodexo Honors Rural Firefighters, Law Enforcement and Active Military Personnel

Initial agreement has been reached with Sodexo between Williams Elementary and Applegate Schools to recognize rural firefighters, law enforcement, and active military personnel by offering a good cup of coffee and cookies anytime the schools are "open for business".
