

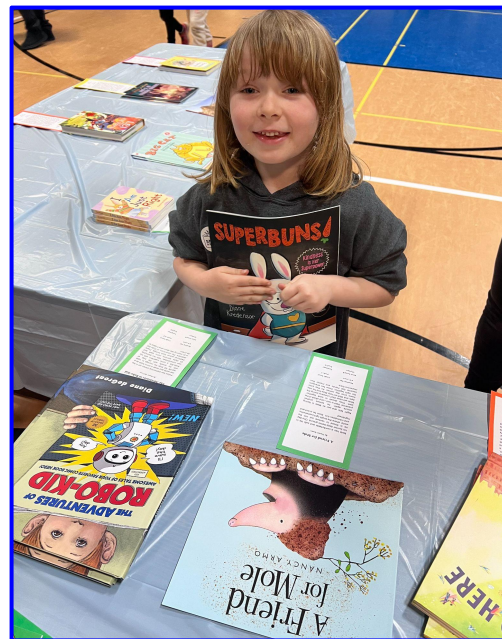
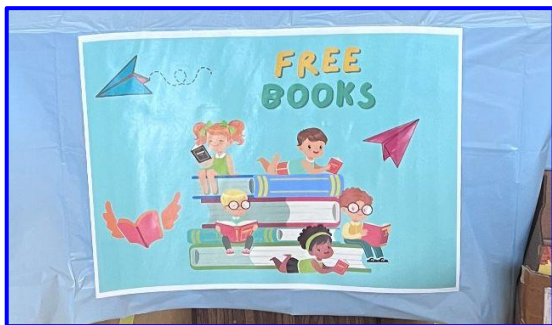
Family Literacy Night

With Help from the ATF and OSEA Literacy Grant, Applegate School was able to hold a Family Literacy Night. For this event we were able to purchase a total of 106 books to give away to grade levels Pre-K through High School.

Over 60 people from Applegate School and Williams Elementary School came to the literacy night.



We invited the Jackson County Library to participate in our literacy night, and they handed out library program information and signed 14 families up for Library cards. 11 of those families received free memberships using the Bixler Fund to alleviate costs. The Bixler Fund is a program that allows students who live in a different county to receive Jackson County Library memberships at no cost.

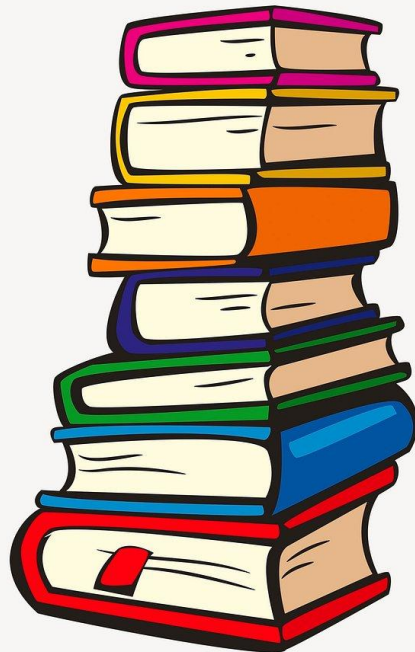

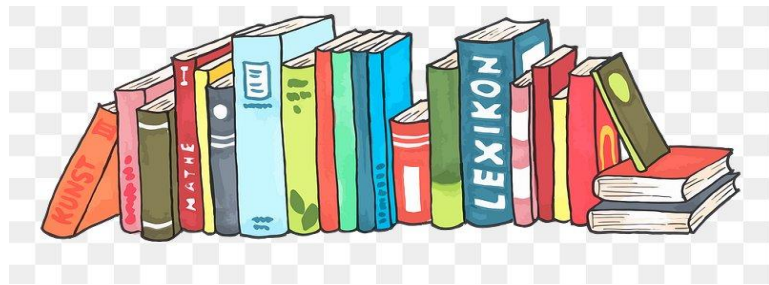


Explaining the challenges to a student
