Instances where reasonable and necessary force or restraint <mark>of a student</mark> may be used by a school official or an employee of the School Board Board when a student's behavior presents a clear, present, and imminent risk to the physical safety of the student and others and is the least restrictive intervention feasible. Examples of behaviors are is limited to:

- 1. Preventing an act that threatens physical injury to any person;
- 2. Obtaining possession of a weapon or other dangerous object within a student's control;
- 3. Defending oneself or others;
- 4. Protecting property;
- 5. Removing a disruptive student from school premises, a school motor vehicle, or a school sponsored activity;
- 6. Preventing a student form harming himself or herself;
- 7. Protecting the safety of others; and
- 8. Maintaining order and control.

Employees shall be subject to discipline, up to and including discharge, for engaging in improper use of force in violation of the District policy.
