Regular Meeting Minutes

The Bristol Board of Education regular meeting was held on Wednesday, February 4, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. in the Bristol Board of Education Auditorium located at 129 Church Street and via Zoom Meeting Platform.

Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence:

Chair Pons called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and asked the audience to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Staff and Student Recognition

Superintendent White recognized Bristol Public Schools School Counselors in honor of National School Counseling Week, observed February 2–6, 2026. She also acknowledged Bristol Public Schools Resource Officers in recognition of National School Resource Officer Day on February 15, 2026.

As part of staff recognitions, Superintendent White expressed appreciation to Sarah Lupa, Director of Adult Education and Supervisor of Secondary TESOL Programming, for her leadership in implementing the LAS testing process and for serving in the role of English Learner Assessment Coordinator during the current school year. Carly Fortin, Chief Academic Officer, spoke on Ms. Lupa's accomplishments and formally introduced her to the Board of Education Commissioners.

Superintendent White also recognized three students from the same family who have each been named Miss Connecticut Teen over the past three years: Haylee Patton (2025), Camryn Patton (2024), and Peyton Troth (2023), the latter of whom previously served as a Board of Education

Student Representative. Superintendent White introduced Miss Patton, who addressed the Board and expressed her gratitude for its continued commitment to Bristol Public Schools and public education. She also spoke about her successors, shared how the Miss Connecticut Teen program has influenced her life, and encouraged attendance at this year's celebration on June 27, 2026, at the Rockwell Theatre in Bristol, Connecticut.

Approval of Minutes

January 7, 2026- Regular Meeting Minutes

The Board of Education voted to approve the January 7, 2026- Regular Meeting Minutes as written.

Motion made by Jennifer Van Gorder and second by Kara Ledger. The motion passed 7-1, with one abstention from Commissioner Osenkowski.

January 14, 2026- Special Meeting Minutes

The Board of Education voted to approve the January 14, 2026- Special Meeting Minutes – as written.

Motion made by Jennifer Van Gorder and second by Kara Ledger. The motion passed unanimously.

Committee Reports

Student Achievement & Outcome Committee – Commissioner Ledger reported that the committee met on January 21, 2026. During the meeting, Lesek Ward presented three proposed curriculum revisions, which were subsequently brought forward to the full Board for consideration later in the agenda. The proposed revisions pertain to Latin 2, World Language 1, and Early Childhood Education (ECE).

School, Family, and Community Partnerships – Commissioner Tedesco reported that the committee met on January 28, 2026. During the meeting, members discussed reconnecting with former committee members to review prior work completed and expressed their commitment to continuing ongoing conversations focused on strengthening engagement with community members.

Policy Committee – Commissioner Fitzsimons-Bula reported that the committee met on January 28, 2026. The committee reviewed four policies, which were scheduled to be presented later in the meeting. She also noted that future committee meetings have been scheduled for the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m.

School Safety Committee – Commissioner Fitzsimons-Bula reported that the committee met on January 14, 2026 items discussed were: ALICE roll out and Camera Update, next meeting will be in May 2026 prior to the Board of Education Regular Meeting.

Finance and Operations Committee – Commissioner Simmons reported that the committee met on January 14, 2026. During the meeting, the committee reviewed the budget update through December 31, 2025, including reports on cafeteria operations, pupil services, student activity accounts, and substitute teachers. The next Finance & Operations Committee meeting is scheduled for February 11, 2026.

Student Representatives Report

Bristol Central

Bristol Central Senior Representative Amelia Browne was not available to provide a report.

Bristol Eastern

Bristol Eastern Senior Representative Paige Ansah presented the monthly student update for February which consisted of past and upcoming events. Paige reported that they have officially completed their first semester and the second semester has begun. Grades 9-11 students will soon begin the process of selecting courses for the next school year, while seniors will be continuing their college and scholarship applications, such as the Main Street Scholarships, whose portal opened on January 15th and will close on March 6th.

The Model United Nations Club has been hard at work preparing for the MUN New York Conference from March 18th to the 22nd. Final paper drafts have been submitted to the dais of each committee for feedback and will be returned for revision in the coming weeks.

For athletics, Bristol Eastern track and field, recently attended the CCC Championships on January 31st, with many of the competing athletes getting new personal records. Congratulations to Jace Kozier for breaking the boys' 1000m school record with a time of 2 minutes, 37 seconds, and 56 milliseconds, as well as Kate Patterson for breaking the girls' 300 meter record with a time of 43 seconds and 82 milliseconds. Track will have their last chance to meet on Monday, February 9th, as well as Boys and Girls Class L Championships on February 12th, both at Floyd Little Athletic Center.

Beta's production of Legally Blonde is in full swing, with theater students having the opportunity to receive master classes from Kevin Rippone, who's an active dance teacher and Bristol Eastern alumni who currently lives in New York. Legally Blonde's opening performance will be on May 1st, and will also be shown on May 2nd and 3rd.

Finally, Culture Day is under way, and Diversity Club students are working on making it bigger and better this year, with Culture Day possibly taking place in the Big Gym and a presentation with the theme of diversity, inclusivity, and appreciation. More information on Culture Day will come soon.

This concluded Bristol Easterns student representative report.

Chair Report

Chair Pons reported that Superintendent Iris White served as the keynote speaker at the Greater Bristol Branch of the NAACP Annual ECW/MLK Jr. Scholarship Breakfast held at Bristol Eastern High School on January 19, 2026. As she was unable to attend, Chair Pons provided a brief synopsis of the event and shared the heartfelt feedback she received regarding Superintendent White's remarks.

Chair Pons expressed her appreciation to Superintendent White for sharing her personal story, leadership, and steadfast dedication to the students, staff, families, and the entire Bristol Public Schools community. She also thanked the Greater Bristol Branch of the NAACP for hosting an event that honors scholarship, service, and the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and for providing district leadership and students the opportunity to participate in such a meaningful and inspiring program.

Chair Pons concluded her report.

Superintendent Report

The Superintendent began her report with an update on the Budget Approval Process Timeline, outlining the following key dates: Superintendent's Budget Workshop #1 – January 24, 2026; Superintendent's Budget Workshop #2 – February 3, 2026; Budget Presentation to the Board of Finance – March 16, 2026; Board of Finance Meeting to Adopt the Budget Estimate – April 28, 2026; and the Joint Meeting of the Board of Finance and City Council to Adopt the 2026–2027 Budget – May 18, 2026.

As part of her commitment to transparency, accountability, and continuous improvement, Superintendent White will continue providing monthly updates to the Board regarding progress toward her Superintendent priorities. She reported that the first Parent Advisory Council meeting was held on January 29, 2026. Feedback from attendees included appreciation for the weekly updates and community events, as well as a request for clearer, simplified explanations of the fiscal budget.

Superintendent White also shared that Bristol Public Schools is collaborating with the Bristol Early Childhood Collaborative. On February 24, 2026, Dr. Amy Martino, Director of Pupil Services, will present an overview of district services followed by a question-and-answer session. The Superintendent additionally provided a brief overview of her participation as keynote speaker at the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Reverend Dr. E.C. Whitehead Scholarship Breakfast held on January 19, 2026.

An update on mental health support was also provided. School Counselors, School Psychologists, and School Social Workers participated in professional learning with the Prudence Crandall Center. Staff learned about real-world situations currently impacting students within the community, as well as indicators and strategies to better support students. Superintendent White

thanked Mikayla Pascucci-Wallace from the Office of Pupil Personnel Services for serving as liaison and coordinating the collaboration with the Prudence Crandall Center.

Superintendent White announced that Bristol Public Schools has launched an official Facebook page to share important updates, upcoming events, celebrations, and district highlights, providing another avenue to keep families informed and connected. She also shared that she has partnered with Bristol Edition to host a monthly segment to provide school-related updates and respond to community questions. Additionally, the district is utilizing ParentSquare to issue smart alerts and notifications for school closures and delays.

To further enhance communication, Superintendent White reported that community flyers are now distributed digitally through ParentSquare in a bi-weekly e-blast around the 1st and 15th of each month. Organizations interested in including information in the e-blast are encouraged to visit the district website for submission guidelines.

Lastly, Superintendent White provided updates on three grants included on the Consent Agenda: the Connecticut Early Start Grant (formerly School Readiness), the Wheels to School Active Transportation Grant, and the Barnes Foundation: CT Storytelling Center Grant.

This concluded the Superintendent's Report.

Pupil Personnel Services Report

Jodi Bond, Director of Finance presented Dr. Amy Martino monthly Pupil Personnel Services Report. Mrs. Bond reported As of February 1, 2026, 1,768 of the 7,868 enrolled Bristol students are identified as requiring Special Education programming. This enrollment reflects 22.47% of the total BPS student population. As of February 1st, 127 students with disabilities required out-of-district placements at private special education school programs. There were 86 students requiring special education programming services at other public out-of-district schools, including magnet schools.

During the month of January 2026, 27% of the newly registered students were identified as students with special education programming needs at the time of registration with 1 student requiring their programming and services at an out-of-district special education school program.

During the month of January, there were (27) 211 calls and (7) 911 calls.

As of January 1st, 2026, all budget lines represented are trending as expected. Though over in a couple of lines, but have yet to receive excess cost funds, tuition reimbursement, and/or medicaid reimbursements.. As previously noted, we were over due to the professional services, contracted services and transportation.

Chair Pons called for a motion to approve Parent Teacher Conference Calendar Update for the 2025-2026 school year and 2026-2027 school year.

14.1 January 1 Enrollment Count for the 2025-2026 School Year

Joseph Grabowski, Chief of Talent Management, presented the January 1 enrollment count for the 2025–2026 school year. Mr. Grabowski provided an overview of enrollment figures across all schools and noted a discrepancy in the report. Specifically, the total K–5 enrollment listed on page 2 should reflect 3,191 students rather than 2,570.

Board members engaged in questions and discussion regarding the report and requested that the corrected enrollment figures be reflected in the Board Book when available.
