

History - MAY 2020 BOND

- Repairing and replacing roofs, boilers, foundations, windows and flooring, and other school facility improvements
- Upgrading safety and security systems
- Adding gymnasiums to four schools without dedicated gyms
- Repurposing Oliver Elementary back into a middle school, including library, science, locker rooms, and career and technical improvements
- \$65M, a maintained \$1.19/\$1,000 of assessed valuation; \$7,464,690 state matching grant








Each student will graduate with the skills necessary to thrive in a diverse and rapidly evolving world.

Approach to Equity


- Form Equity Sub-Committee, in coordination with new District Equity Committee
- Collect and analysis data on student groups and neighborhoods
- Identify Affinity Groups
- Conduct Listening Sessions (students and families)
- Review Affinity Group feedback, draft priorities and action items, present to Facilities Advisory Group




Student Voice

- Robust representation on Facilities Advisory Committee








Educational Alignment, Supportive Environments

Include parent and staff representatives from every school.


Personally invite under-representative affinity groups, removing any barriers.
