This year more than ever, it's important that every member board appoints a delegate—we must have a quorum to conduct the Annual Meeting and Delegate Assembly. The virtual platform makes it easier for delegates across the state to attend and advocate for critical issues in public education.

Consuelo Castillo Kickbusch is a kick-ass Army veteran who has persevered through a lifetime of poverty, illiteracy and discrimination through what she calls courageous leadership. She will share her servant leadership framework and how courage can help leaders LEAD during a crisis—which is particularly fitting during the current COVID-19 pandemic.
