Learning Support Specialist - Reading Intervention for Grades 2 and 3, (2024-2025)

Measurable Results: Provided targeted reading intervention to 18 students (Semester 1) and 15 students (Semester 2), resulting in an average CBMreading fluency growth of 44%, surpassing grade-level peers. Specifically, second-grade caseload students showed a 50% improvement (vs. 39% average), and third-grade students achieved 41% growth (vs. 26% average), indicating the effectiveness of individualized support and evidence-based instruction.

Collaboration: Partnered with teachers, support staff, and administration to monitor grade-level student progress and identify at-risk students. Shared ideas and progress updates regularly.

Adaptability and Flexibility: Adjusted instruction weekly based on assessment data, progress monitoring, and multi-tiered system of supports goals. Modified curriculum content and schedule to meet changing student needs and eligibility.
