PROGRESS REPORTING	The District shall issue grade reports/report cards every nine weeks on a form approved by the Superintendent or designee. Performance shall be measured in accordance with this policy and the standards established in EIE.
INTERIM REPORTS	Interim progress reports may be issued at the teacher's discretion; however, notice of a student's consistent unsatisfactory perfor- mance shall be issued in accordance with law.
CONFERENCES	In addition to conferences scheduled on the campus calendar, con- ferences may be requested by a teacher or parent as needed.
ACADEMIC DISHONESTY	A student found to have engaged in academic dishonesty shall be subject to grade penalties on assignments or tests and disciplinary penalties in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.
