Final 2018 Minnesota K-12 Academic Standards in Arts Education

These go into effect at the beginning of the 2023-24 school year.

The K-8 Minnesota Academic Standards for Visual Arts include:

Creating: Students will demonstrate the ability to create art that communicates their ideas and emotions using a variety of materials and techniques.

Responding: Students will develop an understanding and appreciation of art by analyzing and interpreting artwork and understanding the cultural and historical contexts in which it was created.

Connecting: Students will connect their understanding and experiences of visual art to other subject areas, including science, math, social studies, and language arts.

Presenting: Students will learn to present and exhibit their artwork, communicate their creative process, and understand the role of art in society.

Overall, the standards aim to develop students' creativity, critical thinking, and cultural awareness through the study and creation of visual art.

CCS Instructional Plan and Rationale

For the first time, CCS will be employing an art educator 2 days per week to serve grades PK-8. Each class will have a one hour standards-based art class once per week for the 2023-24 academic year.

Classroom and content area teachers will also participate in the instruction of visual art through cross curricular integration.

Cross curricular inclusion of the arts standards involves integrating the study and creation of visual art into core content lessons, such as math, science, social studies, and language arts. This approach allows students to make connections between different subjects and deepen their understanding of the material while also developing their artistic skills and creativity.

For example, in a math lesson, students may use shapes and patterns to create a work of art, while also learning about geometric concepts such as symmetry and angles. In a social studies lesson, students may study different cultures and create artwork inspired by those

cultures, while also learning about the historical and social contexts in which the artwork was created.

Incorporating art into core content lessons can also help to increase student engagement and motivation, as it provides a creative outlet for students who may not excel in traditional academic areas. Additionally, it encourages students to think critically and creatively, and to develop their communication and problem-solving skills.

Overall, cross curricular inclusion of the arts standards is a valuable approach to teaching that provides students with a more well-rounded and integrated learning experience. It helps students to see the connections between different subjects and to develop a greater appreciation for the role that art plays in our world.

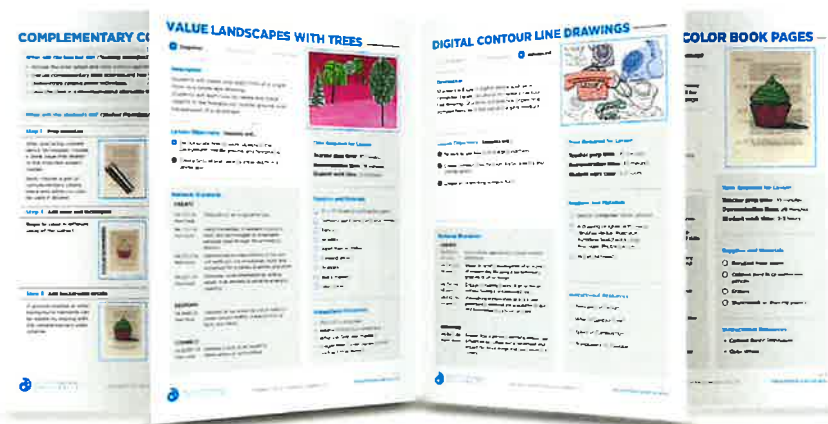

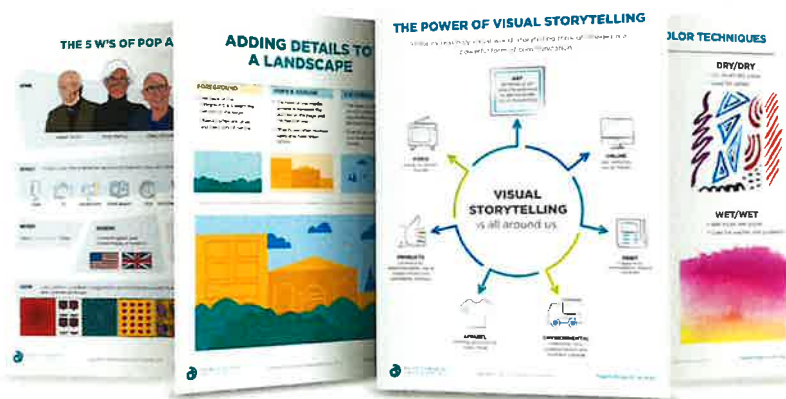
