### **Robotics**

This was an exciting FLL Robotics season. NSBSD had teams at Tikiġaq, Nunamiut, Alak, Trapper, Meade River, Hopson, and Harold Kaveolook schools. We were able to have teams come into Utqiaġvik for two events. Teams gathered to launch the season for the last week of September.
