Follow - Up to Vo Ag and IT Positions:

We have some ongoing concerns that have been shared with us. Tony Heiden and Steve Highum met with Mr. Timm and myself on Monday evening to discuss options for our Vo Ag Courses and FFA Program. It was a productive meeting and we will work to improve our Vo Ag course offerings.

Mr. Timm will continue to explore options and refine the schedule. He will begin putting the schedule together for next year.

We did advertise for a .38 Ag/IT position for next year.

Vehicle Inspection:

This was conducted on Tuesday (4.10). We did have Van #6 that was red tagged due to some rust on the body. The estimated cost of repair is more than we want to invest because this van will reach the age limit as of Jan. 1st, 2019. We are searching for a replacement.

Also, our Van #3 (10 passenger van), has reached the age limit (12 years) and can no longer be used to transport students. We will be recommending the purchase of a new 10 passenger van for the 2019 – 20 school year. This will be purchased through the State Bid Program. The estimated purchase price will be approximately \$31,000.00.

My thanks to Laura and Rod for their help and assistance with the inspection. They have done a great job of making sure that our paperwork and vehicles are in compliance and meet the safety standards.
