All students will have their poster complete by the January BES board meeting on January 31, 2018. Each board member will get a personal invite to a classroom to view their posters.




Christmas Program

ELA-ISIP Data for December for 2nd and 3rd grade





- ❖ All teachers participated in an Instructional Round. The teachers took notes, debriefed, and reflected as they observed Routines and Procedures during Math or ELA. During the debrief each teacher wrote what they will continue to do because that particular Routine/Procedure was validated in other classrooms. Teachers got a chance to observe new ideas that they would like to put into place within their own classrooms.
- Classroom teachers revisited the discussion of writing within ELA and shared graphic organizers for different writing assignments. Third grade will have students draw out their graphic organizers in preparation for SBAC in April.
- ❖ All staff went over the data for ELA and reflected on what changes they would make in their instruction.
- Classrooms are working on the Honor Your Life posters and some will have students type using google docs. They will then be displayed throughout the hallways at BES.
