RE: School Calendar and Reduction Days this year

Dear School Community,

Thank you for your patience regarding the calendar and the ending date for school this year. Even though it does not look like spring with all of the rain, I know that during this season of the year people begin to get both excited and a little anxious about planning end of the year events. Not knowing the official last day of school adds an extra load to the planning process. As soon as we know definitively how many days we are able to restore this year, we will send out an immediate notification.

I want to share with you what we know for sure, and when we hope to know the rest. I hope this information will help everyone in their planning process.

What we know:

- **Graduation at all three high schools will be on the days and times previously scheduled. Graduation will not change.**

Every budget projection has us restoring at least two of the five school days meaning students will be in school at least until June 4th. Teachers would then have a clerical day on June 7th.

When we hope to know the rest:

- **We should receive an updated payment estimate for this year on May 17th which means we should be able to officially announce the last day of school on or before May 21st.**

- **There are four possible scenarios for the end of school:**

1. **As stated earlier, the last day for students is June 4th and teachers have a clerical day on June 7th.**
2. **The last day for students is June 7th and teachers have a clerical day on June 8th.**
3. **The last day for students is June 8th and teachers have a clerical day on June 9th.**

The last day for students is June 9th and teachers have a clerical day on June 10th.

Everyone will know by May 21st. If you have to plan an end of the year event with certainty before May 21st, I believe your best bet is to plan it for June 4th knowing that students may be attending school some of the following week.

I hope this information helps!

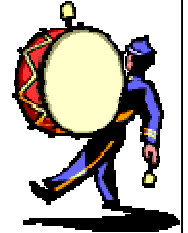

SENIOR PROJECTS:

The last opportunity for seniors to present their projects is May 13, 2010 from 4:00 – 5:45. Only 17 seniors took advantage of the February 18th opportunity. Senior parents, please, work with your student and encourage them to not procrastinate. Passing all components of the Senior Project is a requirement for graduation. Letters went home on March 16, 2010 listing the components each student needs to complete. Information about the overall senior project requirements follows below:

The Senior Project (officially known as the Career-Related Learning Standards and Extended Application) has been a state graduation requirement starting with the class of 2007. The two components of the project are passing the Senior Futures Forum class or the Senior College Prep class and passing the oral presentation. In their classes students research future careers, complete resumes and job applications, research post-secondary options and do mock interviews. In addition, they write a reflection paper on how their high school experiences have prepared them for their futures, connecting their high school experience to their post-secondary plans.

Students will present their project to a panel of judges comprised of administrators, school staff and community members. Projects are scored using the state scoring guide. Students must provide evidence of meeting two or more of the *Essential Skills* such as reading and interpreting text, applying math, speaking effectively and demonstrating community involvement. They must also include evidence that their project reflects two or more of the *Work Ethic Skills* such as time management, reliability, initiative, dedication, checking for accuracy, etc.

Senior Project Orals are an opportunity for students to present an accomplishment of which they are proud that demonstrates their overall preparedness to move on to life past high school.

CREDIT RETREIVAL

There are only 7 weeks left to make up any failed credits from your four years of high school. If you have classes to make up see Ms. Gutierrez in room, 9. She is available Monday—Thursday from 3:30 to 5:30. Take advantage of this opportunity to make up those credits needed for graduation. Seniors who have been putting this off—time is quickly running out.

VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR SENIORS FROM DIANNA HALL—the BOOKKEEPER

Attention to the parents and seniors of the class of 2010. Collectively, your class currently has class / sports fines of more than \$1700.00. This **does not** include textbook or library fines. Please take care of these as soon as possible. No diploma will be issued to a student who owes any money or item to the school—including book fines.

TO PARENTS OF SENIORS

This is the time of year to keep in close contact with the academic progress of your senior student. We have some seniors who are on a plan with counseling in order to complete all their credits for graduation on June 1st. Do not just assume that your student is doing what needs to be done. Stay in contact with their teachers, Ms. Tucker or one of the administrators to make sure your student is on target. The final senior project presentation date is May 13th. Keep asking your student if they are making progress on completing that project and preparing their presentation.

The last day of school for seniors is **May 28th**. Students must have everything complete by the end of that day in order to walk at graduation on June 1st.

In February, some Illinois Valley High School students went to the FireHouse Gallery in Grants Pass to view their art work that was done with the students at Head Start. The IVHS Art Department has an on-going cooperative project with Head Start that provides mentoring by the IVHS students on a weekly basis. Inspired by a printmaking show at the Grants Pass Museum of Art, IV students used the creation of "texture boards" with the pre-schoolers to create their own series of collographs.

Savannah Bassett was a student who knew how to give back to her school and community. The Savannah Bassett Memorial Good Citizen Award is an annual award of \$1,000, and will be given to an Illinois Valley High School Senior who has been nominated by his/her peers and/or teachers. Students who are having issues with each other are encouraged to fill out a Conflict Resolution Request Form and turn it in to Mr. McKee or the main office. Conflict resolution sessions are treated with complete confidentiality, and studies show that schools which implement these types of programs show a significant decline in physical altercations on campus.
