Extended School Year (ESY)

Tutoring

- Individualized in-person instruction based a student's goals and objectives in the IEP.
- Case Managers provided instructional materials aligned with goals and objectives.
- Total participants: 75 students (K-12)
- OT, PT, Speech services built into schedule.




Camp Kelly

- Twenty days of in-person instruction
- Preschool students receiving Special Education Services
- OT, PT, and Speech provided during the hours of the program
- Total participants: 11 students



Secondary Vocational Program

- Individualized in-person instruction based a student's goals and objectives in the IEP.
- Academic, Social and Vocational skill instruction
- Total participants: 11 students (7-12+)
- OT, PT, Speech services built into schedule.



Enrichment Programming



- Total participants: 139 total registrations (increase of 29)
- Classes for grades 1-3, and 4-6
- Hands-on science experiments, building robots and programming them, clay projects, watercolor painting, and strings performances were just some of the experiences for students
- Additional opportunities in science and art
- Three student volunteers



Credit Recovery

- Conducted in person for 3.5 weeks
- To remediate credit toward graduation requirements.
- Use of online programming alongside teacher tutoring.
- Total participants: 11 students

RAMP Intervention

- Students invited based on intervention services
- Total participants: 38 students
- Grades 1-6 (1-3 together and 4-6 together)
- One hour of reading/writing and one hour of math
- 3 weeks, 5 days per week







Salmon Brook Park Camp

- Offered to all Open Choice Participants in grades 1-8 for Week 8, August 5th-10th, Theme: The Music In You
- Bussing provided at central locations for all students
- 4 students participated in Mission
 Adventures(6th-8th grade), which includes field trips
- 8 students participated in grades 1-5 camp
- Lunch provided







High School Happenings



AP Powerboost

- First-time AP students invited to one week program to boost skills for AP courses.
- Total participants:26 students
- Grades 9-12
- Activities included study skills, note-taking skills, support for summer assignments, and team-building/collaboration

College Exploration Summer Seminar

- **29 students** entering grades 10-12 participated in the three-day program.
- This was the fourteenth summer session since the program began in 2008.
- Students visited Trinity College, UCONN, Worcester Polytechnic Institute, Assumption University, Bryant University, and University of Rhode Island.
- Each visit included a tour and an information session, followed by reflective conversation and journaling.
