One of the key elements of the renovation was the introduction of porcelain steel dry erase desktops. 1,800 durable porcelain steel top desks and tables and 2,200 chairs were acquired to fill classrooms, art rooms, and science labs. Proven to encourage collaboration and creativity, dry erase desktops are an extraordinary tool to create dynamic, active-learning spaces for diverse learners to take notes, share ideas, and doodle.

Only available through MooreCo, porcelain steel is 2.5x harder and 2x more scratch resistant than standard laminate dry erase surfaces. Its smooth surface is bacterial resistant and resists delamination when cleaned with chemicals, resulting in a healthier environment for students. The surface offers superior writability and erasability, reduces eye glare, does not ghost, and their magnetic surface provides a unique and versatile platform for learning. Most importantly, MooreCo porcelain steel is backed by a 50-year surface guarantee. Standard dry erase desks breakdown in as little as 3–5 years, leaving the district with a financial burden and making a lasting impact on the environment.

<u>Hierarchy Creator Rectangle Desks</u> and <u>Hierarchy</u> <u>Activity Tables</u> can be rearranged in countless ways and are staples in an active classroom. Paired with <u>Hierarchy 4-Leg Chairs</u>, these classrooms can be adapted to fit nearly any teaching style and accommodate all learners. Inclusive furnishings that meet the sensory needs of students like <u>Soft Sway</u> <u>Rocking Chairs</u> and sit-to-stand <u>Up-Rite Student</u> <u>Desks</u> ensure that all students can find their ideal place to learn.
