# Summarized ILCS 5/10-20.14

Section 105 ILCS 5/10-20.14 of the Illinois School Code outlines requirements for school boards regarding student discipline policies. These measures aim to create a collaborative approach to student discipline, ensuring policies are comprehensive, well-communicated, and effectively implemented.

- 1. **Parent-Teacher Advisory Committee**: School boards must establish and maintain a committee to collaborate with parents and teachers in developing guidelines on pupil discipline, including school searches and bullying prevention.
- 2. Policy Distribution and Review:
  - **Distribution**: The developed policy must be provided to parents or guardians within 15 days after the school year begins or within 15 days after a new student enrolls.
  - **Review**: The policy should be reviewed annually by the advisory committee, school board, and charter school governing bodies, evaluating its implementation and considering factors affecting school safety.
- 3. Reciprocal Reporting System
- 4. School Bus Safety Procedures
- 5. Support for At-Risk Students

**Note**: While the school code specifies that the advisory committee should be composed of representatives from both**parents** and **teachers**, the exact composition can vary based on the needs of the district.





#### Standing Board Committees

A standing committee is created for an indefinite term although its members will fluctuate. Standing committees are:

- 1. Board Policy Committee.
- 2. Finance, Public Relations, Operations, and Negotiations
- 3. Parent-Teacher Advisory Committee. This committee assists in the development of student behavior policy and procedure, and provides information and recommendations to the Board. Its members are parents/guardians and teachers, and may include persons whose expertise or experience is needed. The committee reviews such issues as administering medication in the schools, reciprocal reporting between the School District and local law enforcement agencies regarding criminal offenses committed by students, student discipline, disruptive classroom behavior, school bus safety procedures, and the dissemination of student conduct information.
