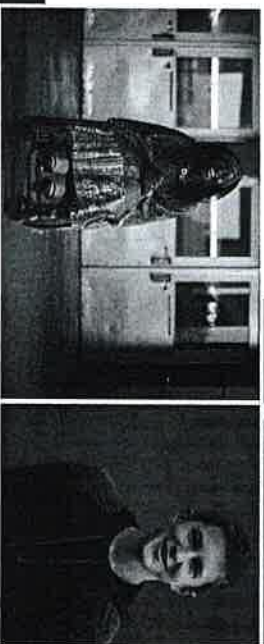

The Legislature made an historic investment in school facilities during the 2015 legislative session. OSBA helped lead the efforts to secure \$175 million for seismic upgrades to K-12 and community college facilities, and \$125 million to match local K-12 general obligation bonds.
