

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I hear from multigenerational residents that the building is a "historical landmark." As such, some feel it should be kept as a school building regardless of cost and current function. The reality is that the campus is unfit for occupying. The heating system can't be saved or replaced. It has no AC. It is falling apart, infested with vermin, and covered in dangerous mold. The windows don't allow for heat/cold regulation. It is an embarrassment at this point and shouldn't be saved or improved. To do so would be a waste of money. Have a state government official, or group of officials take a tour, see the embarrassing building first hand, and then try to sale it as is, knowing that it will ultimately be torn down as only the land has value. It is past time to swallow our pride and move on.

I'd like to see the central office closed and put up sale. The CO crew could be housed in the Jr. High. The space is already being heated and used for other purposes. I do not want to see the Jr. High leased to a Charter school or sold at this time. We need to continue this year and see how our finances play out.

I would like to see the junior high stay under WBCSD 83 ownership. Our community has worked tremendously hard to keep co-curricular and extracurricular programs running after multiple failed levies. The facilities that the junior high offers for athletics, drama, music programs, etc are too much of an asset to our schools to just sell off and not have guaranteed use of. I would be open to using it as a district office and keeping PRLHS as a Junior/Senior high school. You never know with all of the growth in our community, we may end up needing it as a school building in the future. I think we definitely could look at charging fees for programs to use the facilities for all types of events. The junior high building is the only school facility that offers baseball and softball fields as well as an auditorium. We are already fighting over practice space while currently utilizing its gymnasium.
