# Annual Certification of Provision of Instructional Materials

In accordance with [Texas Education Code §31.1011](#), school systems are required to certify annually to the State Board of Education and the Commissioner of Education that students have access to instructional materials that cover all Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for all required subjects, except physical education.

# 2026-2027 Certification Tools

The TEA's certification process utilizes the following tools:

## ***Certification Pre-work Form for 2026-2027***

A fillable and printable PDF intended to mirror the online survey and provide guidance for successful survey completion. The prework form is to be completed offline and presented to Board of Trustees for ratification and signatures.

## ***Certification Survey for 2026-2027***

Web-based application where school systems will submit the responses collected on the TEKS Certification PreWork Form and upload the completed signature page.

# 2026-2027 Certification Survey - Overview

## ★ Scope and Sequence

- *Instructional materials are managed at the local school system level and are generally consistent across classrooms within the same grade level.*

## ★ Certification of TEKS Coverage

- *Instructional materials are provided that cover 100% of the content/grade level TEKS.*
  - English Reading Language Arts K-12
  - Mathematics K-12
  - Social Studies K-12
  - Science K-12
  - Career and Technical Education
  - Languages other than English
  - Health
  - Physical Education
  - Fine Arts
  - Career and Technical Education
  - Technology Applications
  - Personal Financial Literacy

## ★ Children's Internet Protection Act Certification

# Children's Internet Protection Act

In accordance with Texas Administrative Code 19 TAC §66.105, school districts are required to certify that they protect against access to obscene or harmful content.

The 2025-26 Certification Survey includes a section that allows a school district to certify that they are in compliance with:

- (i) Children's Internet Protection Act (Pub. L. No. 106-554);
- (ii) Section [28.0022](#);
- (iii) Section [43.22](#), Penal Code; and
- (iv) any other law or regulation that protects students from obscene or harmful content.

# Certification Process for 2026-2027

The certification process requires:

- Completion of the Certification 2026-2027 Prewrite Form,
- Ratification by Board of Trustees in an open public-noted meeting,
- Submission of the Certification 2026-2027 Survey with the last page of the ratified Certification 2026-2027 Prewrite Form included in the upload

*TEA recommends these steps be completed by May 1, 2026.*
