**Data Sources:** Student Survey, Annual Megafile, Annual ADM File.

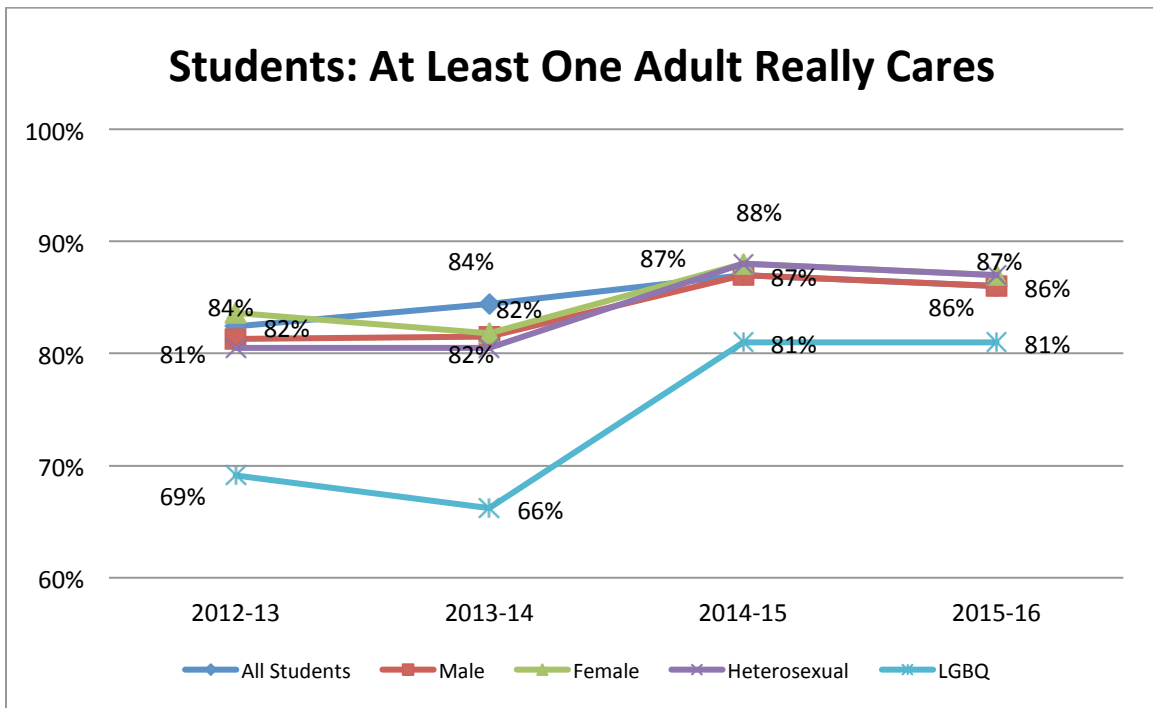
At the district level, no results are reported for student surveys when there are fewer than 30 respondents.

At the school level, results are reported for student surveys only when there are than 30 respondents or more and the overall response rate is at least 40%.

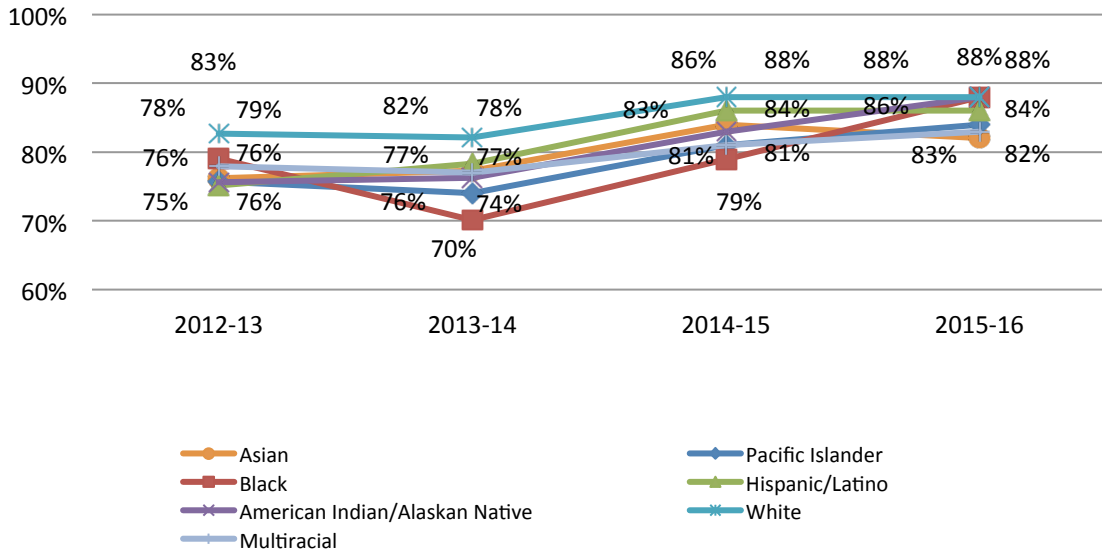

## **Students Reporting that at Least One Adult in School Really Cares About Them**

### **Analysis**

#### **Successes:**

- A three-year trend upward in all students in grades 9-12 who report that at least one adult at school really cares about them
- Implementation of AVID elective classes at grades 7 and 10 during the 2015-2016 school year
- All administrators participation in two days of Culturally Relevant Teaching staff development
- The percent of students reporting that one adult at school really cares about them increased significantly among Black students.

#### **Issues:**

- Continued lack of staff that reflects the diversity of student demographics
- The use of the Early Warning System is not consistent at secondary schools as a tool to enhance student to staff relationships. Not all schools have developed systems of intervention utilizing EWS data.

### **Action Plan**

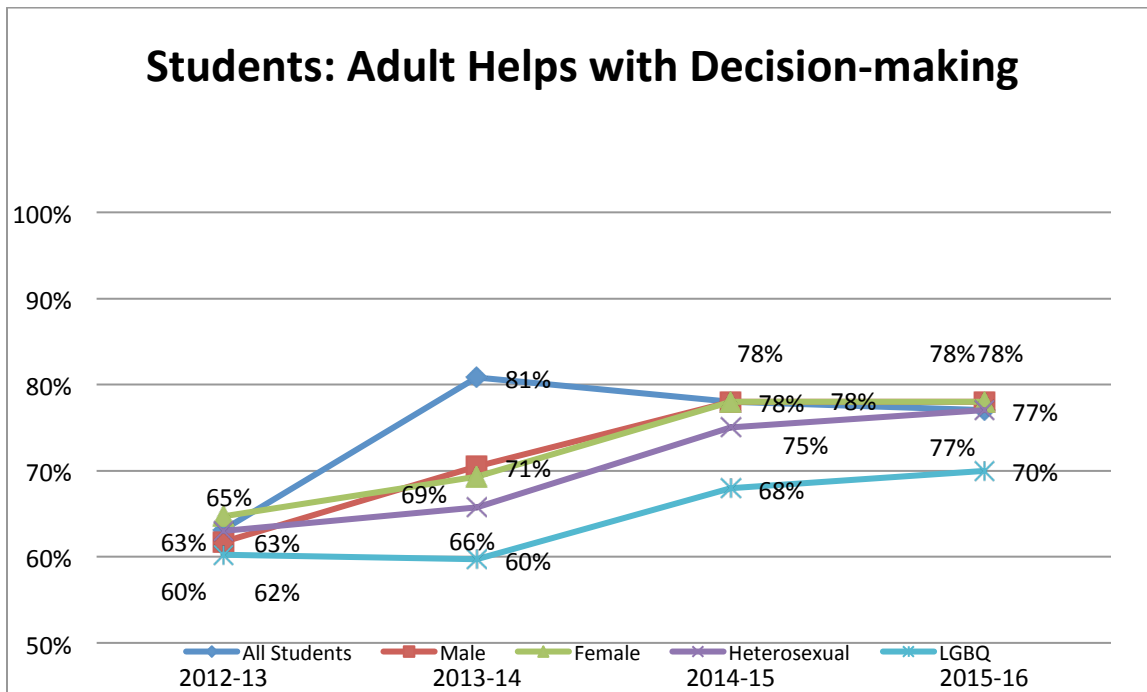
#### **This year:**

- Continue to implement and utilize the Early Warning System
- Continue the expansion of AVID
- Continue to support schools in building Restorative Justice practices
- Continue to train and support administrators to coach teachers on building their classroom climate and culture using the 5D+ Framework
- Recruit and train 340 AVID tutors including 40 District Office staff and 30 work study students
- Offer Equity Seminar Series to all BSD Staff with City of Beaverton and THPRD
- Provide “refresher” of Culturally Relevant Training for administrators

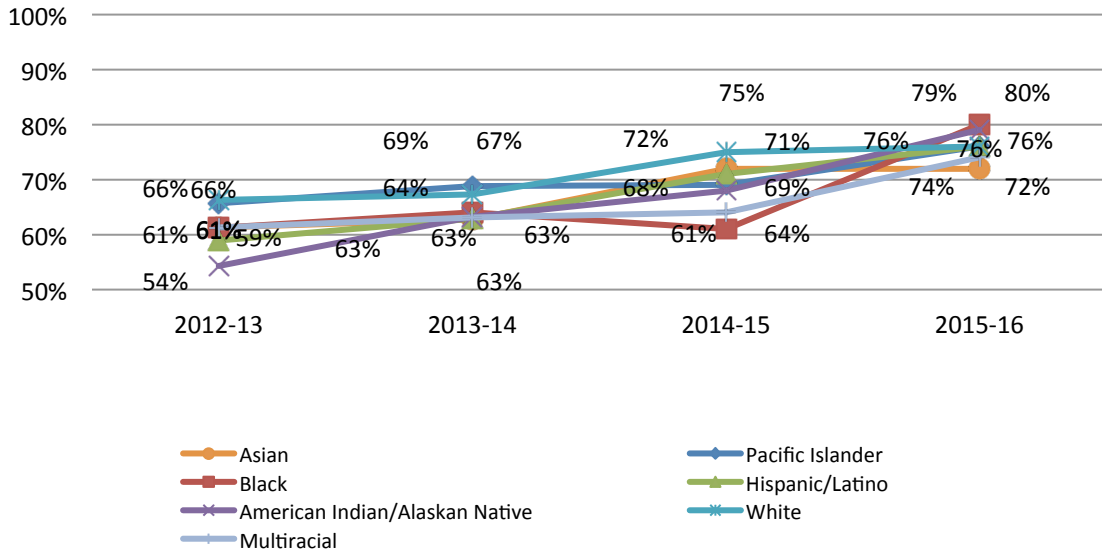
**Long Term:**

- Continue to support teachers in creating a positive classroom climate
- Continue to model culturally relevant teaching practices with staff and train staff on their implementation
- Partner with NSIF and AVID to raise money to support K-12 AVID implementation

## **Students Who Report Having an Adult at School Helping Them with Decision-Making**

### **Analysis**

#### **Successes:**

- Black, Pacific Islander, Hispanic/Latino, American Indian/Alaskan, White, Native, Multiracial, Heterosexual, and LGBTQ students reported increased percentages in adults helping them with decision making.
- The work of the Outreach Specialist increased the number of students returning to school that had previously left.

#### **Issues:**

- Continued lack of staff that reflects the diversity of student demographics
- Overall, larger class sizes at the secondary level compared to the elementary level

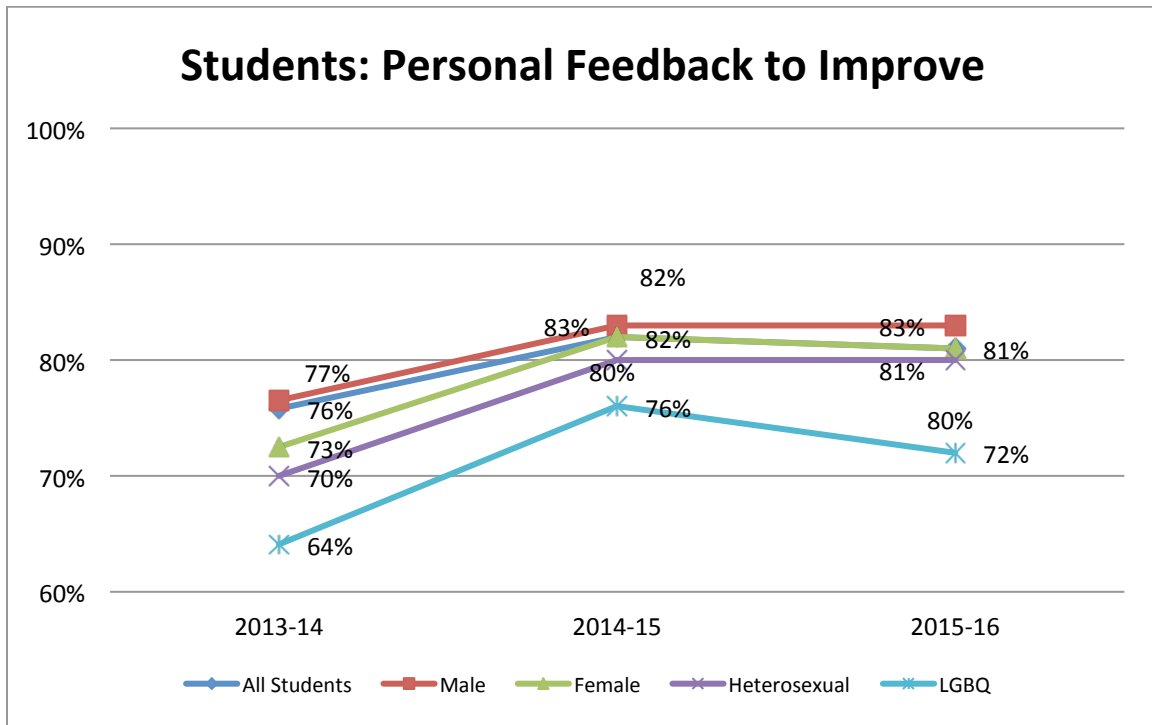

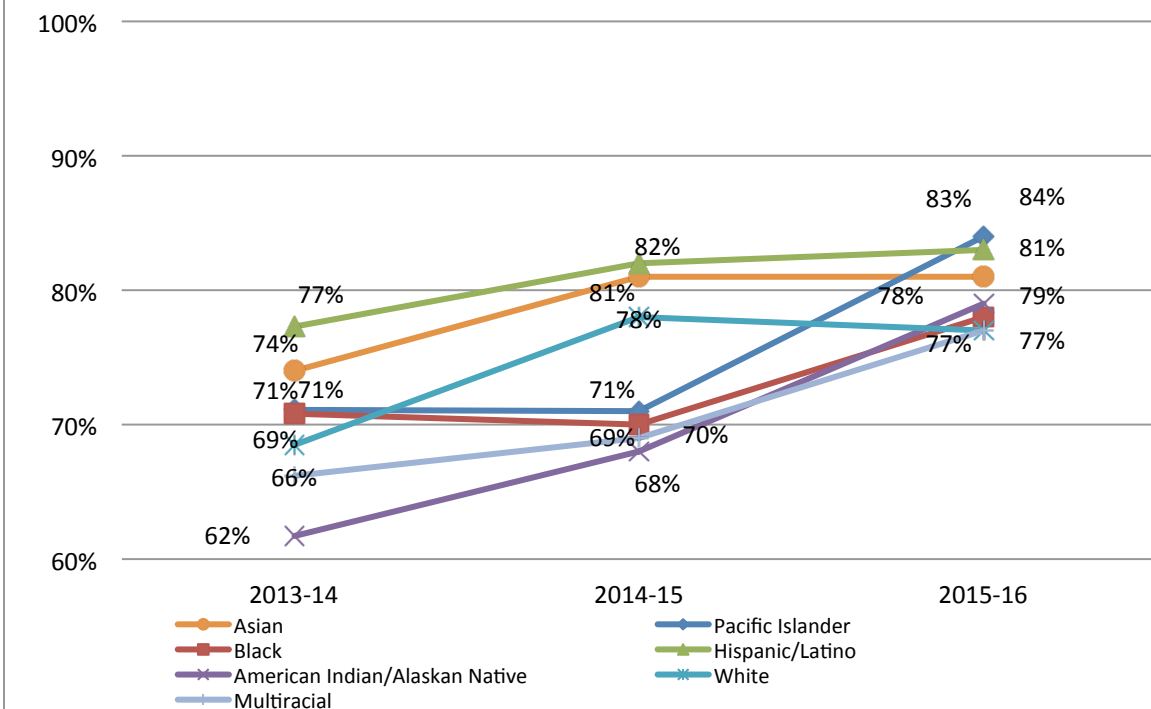

- Teachers need professional development to provide students with targeted feedback that is frequent and of high quality.

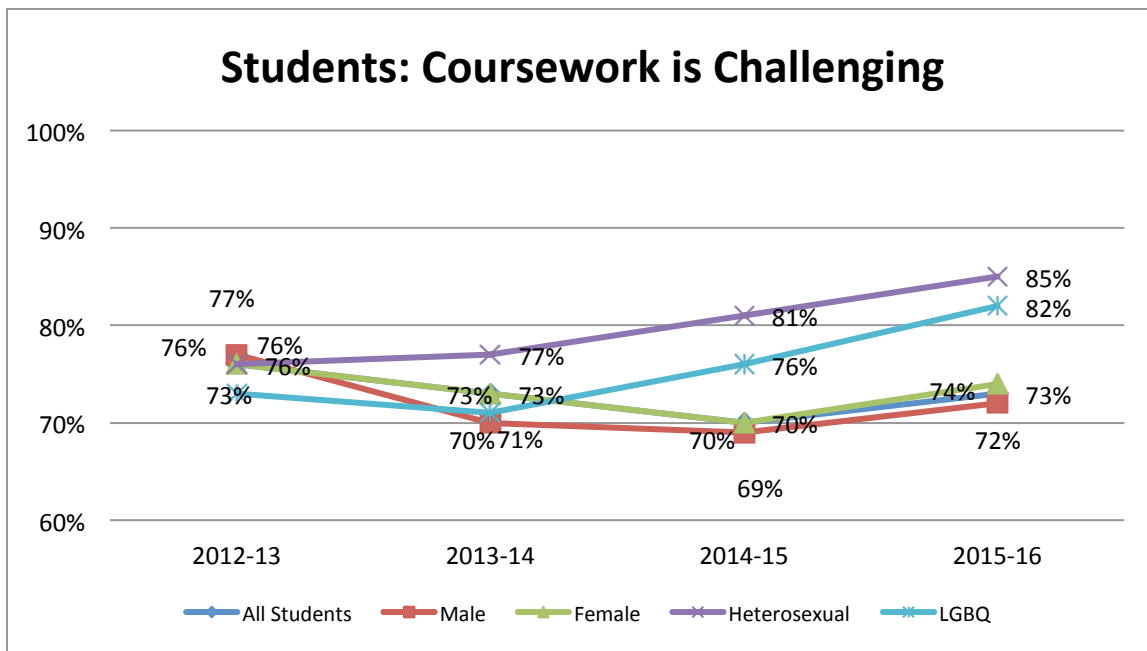
