PRE-K UPDATES

This week in pre-k, we will be exploring the four seasons, winter,	spring, summer, and fall; the sun	
warms the earth; the rotation of the earth creates night and day;	and the weather and seasons	
affect our clothing choices.		

In math, we will be learning that a cycle is a repeating pattern and that patterns can be represented in a circle or in a line.

In literacy, we will learn that words can be separated into two parts (onset and rime) and blended back together; Sentences begin with an uppercase letter and end with a punctuation mark; each letter of the alphabet has a unique name, sound, and shape. Lastly, we will classify words into groups.

1ST GRADE UPDATES

We will continue

troduce our **O** 188 ne adventures

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through research. These stories will increase their vocabulary and reading comprehension skills. We will continue with unit 7 in skills. Students will continue with the idea of sequencing for instructional writing and reading from the unit decodables. We will finish the week in skills with a reading assessment, reading fluency assessment, and word reading in isolation assessment. In math, we will be reviewing time to the hour and half hour. We will also be reviewing the collecting, sorting, and organizing of data using tally marks or t-charts. In science, we will begin a new unit comparing ways that young animals resemble their parents.

2ND GRADE UPDATES

This week, we're continuing with all of the same exciting units across our subjects. In Knowledge, students are still exploring our unit Up, Up and Away: The Age of Aviation, where they're learning about the history of flight and famous aviators. In Skills, we're guiding students through the process of writing a nonfiction report by helping them research, organize, and put their ideas together step by step. In Math, we're continuing our work on telling time, identifying 2D shapes, and understanding fractions as equal parts of a whole. In Science, students will learn about producers and consumers to understand how animals depend on other living things to meet their needs. In Social Studies, students will talk about their experiences in creating their own business. We have an exciting week ahead filled with interactive activities and meaningful learning experiences!

3RD GRADE UPDATES

This week in Reading, we will continue our study of Colonial America. We will read about The Middle Colonies, The Quakers, Lenni Lenape, and Life in Colonial America, and The Road to Revolution. We will use the text to respond to questions, write responses, identify cause and effect; as well as identify key ideas and supporting details. We will also finish our I-Ready diagnostic testing. In Math, we will wrap up our Geometry and Measurement unit. We will review the area and perimeter of a rectangle, as well as missing side lengths. We will also revisit two-dimensional shapes including guadrilaterals and how they are classified. In addition, we will classify and sort three dimensional shapes according to their attributes. In Science, we will create a brochure about an ecosystem. It's going to be a great week in third grade!

4TH GRADE UPDATES

In ELAR, students have finished their iReady diagnostic testing, and we are so proud of the growth they've shown! This week, they will begin working on a 4th Grade Memory Book, where they'll reflect on and write about their experiences throughout the year.

In Social Studies, we'll be learning about modern Texas and the important individuals who have influenced the state's development.

In Math and Science, students will take their Math diagnostic test in iReady this week. As we enter our last full week of school, we're wrapping up our projects and preparing for presentations during the final week. Students will continue refining their work and adding the finishing touches to their

TIK TOK TREND AFFECTING STUDENTS AND SCHOOLS

We are reaching out to inform you about a serious safety concern that has recently come to our attention involving certain social media trends. Some of these online videos and challenges promote the dangerous and highly unsafe behavior of inserting foreign objects—such as coins, keys, or metal pieces—into electrical outlets or devices.

These actions can lead to severe electrical burns, fires, property damage, or even life-threatening injuries. Unfortunately, curiosity and peer influence—especially in younger children and teens—can lead them to attempt what they see online without understanding the real danger.

STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL – SAFETY PROCEDURES

Jarrell ISD utilizes the Standard Response Protocols (SRP) as part of our district-wide safety plan. Below are the protocols that define the difference between a "Hold," "Secure," "Lockdown," "Evacuate," and "Shelter." It's critical our parents, students, staff, and community know the difference. When people know the protocols, it helps reduce anxiety and prevents misinformation from spreading.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will

be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol. COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an all-hazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that The premise is angle - there are the specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is per-formed by active participants, including students, staft, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shetter.

HOLD

- "In Your Classroom or Area"
- Students are trained to: · Clear the hallways and remain in
- their area or room until the "All Clear" is announced Do business as usual
- Adults and staff are trained to:
- Close and lock the door
- · Account for students and adults Do business as usual

SECURE

"Get Inside. Lock outside doors"

- Students are trained to: Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual Adults and staff are trained to:
- Bring everyone indoors
 Lock the outside doors
- Increase situational awareness .
- · Account for students and adults
- · Do business as usual



- Students are trained to: Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Adults and staff are trained to: Recover students from halway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights · Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- · Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

EVACUATE "To a Location"

Students are trained to:

- · Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone Follow instructions
- Adults and staff are trained to: Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to bring anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- · Account for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.

SHELTER State Hazard and Safety Strategy

Hazards might include:

- Tornado
- Hazmat Earthquake
- Tsunami
- Safety Strategies might include: Evacuate to shelter area Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground

- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies
 Adults and staff are trained in:
- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies
 Accounting for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.





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In the event of a live incident, parents may have questions about their role.

SECURE "Get Inside. Lock outside doors"



Secure is called when there is something dangerous outside of the building. Students and staff are brought into the building and the outside doors will be locked. The school might display the Building is Secured poster on entry doors or nearby windows. Inside, it will be business as usual.

SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A SECURE EVENT? Probably not. Every effort is made

to conduct classes as normal during a secure event. Additionally, parents may be asked to stay outside during a Secure event.

WHAT IF PARENTS NEED TO PICK UP THEIR STUDENT?



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SCHOOL IS SECURED

Depending on the situation, it may not be safe to release the student. As the situation evolves, Secure might change to a Monitored Entry and/or Controlled Release.

WILL PARENTS BE NOTIFIED WHEN A SCHOOL GOES INTO SECURE?

When a secure event is brief or the hazard is non-violent, like a wild animal on the playground, there may not be a need to notify parents while the Secure is in place.

With longer or more dangerous events, the school should notify parents that the school has increased their security.





A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence.

A Lockdown is only initiated when there is an active threat inside or very close to the building.

SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A LOCKDOWN?

The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school during a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding. It is unlikely that parents will be granted access to the building or even the campus. If parents are already in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as well.

SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

WHAT ABOUT UNANNOUNCED DRILLS?

The school may conduct unscheduled drills, however it is highly discouraged to conduct one without announcing that it as a drill. That's called an unannounced drill and can cause undue concern and stress.

Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial announcement.



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It's important to differentiate between a **drill** and an exercise. A drill is used to create the "Muscle Memory" associated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event; this is simply performing the action. An exercise simulates an actual event to test the capacity of personnel and equipment.

CAN PARENTS OBSERVE OR PARTICIPATE IN THE DRILLS?

The school welcomes parents who wish to observe or participate in drills.


