COOPERATIVE WORKING AGREEMENT

This *Cooperative Working Agreement is entered between Eagle Pass ISD and the Serving Children and Adults In Need (SCAN), Inc. Family and Youth Success (FAYS) Program for the purpose of networking, service coordination, and referrals of drug prevention and intervention activities/ services for students during FY 2022-23. This CWA also serves to maximize resources by preventing the duplication of services.

SCAN, Inc agrees to provide services to the students at Eagle Pass ISD:

The Family and Youth Success (FAYS) Program addresses family conflict and everyday struggles while promoting strong families and youth resilience. FAYS offers one-on-one coaching or counseling with a trained professional and group-based learning for youth and parents. FAYS program also operates a 24-hour hotline for families having urgent needs.

Eagle Pass ISD agrees to:

- 1. Refer students between the ages of 6-17 to participate in the FAYS Program activities.
- 2. Provide an appropriate location for FAYS program staff to provide services at the school if needed.
- 3. Work in conjunction with SCAN to ensure that program participants receive comprehensive prevention and intervention services.

Furthermore, Eagle Pass ISD,

(1) Acknowledges that in receiving, storing, processing, or otherwise dealing with any information from SCAN, Inc. about the participants in the program, it is fully bound by the provisions of the federal regulations governing Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records, 42 CFR Part 2, and (2) undertakes to resist in judicial proceedings any effort to obtain access to information pertaining to participants otherwise than as expressly provided for in the federal confidentiality regulations, 42 CFR Part 2.

Terms and Termination:

The terms of this cooperative working agreement shall begin September 1, 2023 and will end on August 31, 2024.

Amendment and Modification:

This agreement may be amended by agreement of the parties above mentioned. Said amendment or modification will become a part of this agreement. In witness thereof, this cooperative working agreement has been executed by each agency's authorized representative on the dates listed below:
