ESSER III USE OF FUNDS PLAN Horizon Montessori Public Schools

HMPS's total ESSER III federal grant allocation is \$3,574,138. Of the total allocation, at least 20% or \$714,828 must be reserved and expended to address learning loss through the implementation of evidence-based interventions and ensure that those interventions respond to students' social, emotional, and academic needs and address the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on underreported student subgroups. The district engaged stakeholders in an opportunity to provide meaningful consultation through an online survey regarding the ESSER III grant opportunity. The following stakeholders were invited to participate in the survey: 1) students 2) parents or guardians 3) school staff including campus, central, special education administrations, teachers, other educators, and auxiliary staff 4) board members, community and other stakeholders as designated in the ESSER III guidelines. Additionally the ESSER Committee collectively reviewed the stakeholder survey and completed the ESSER III planning template including needs analysis and use of funds as well as an analyzed student achievement pre- and post-pandemic.
