Sur	Summary: Texas Senate Bill (SB) 13 expands parental rights and transparency in school libraries by requiring public access to library catalogs, allowing parents to restrict their child's access to specific materials, and establishing a mandatory review process for proposed materials. The la further mandates that before any new material can be approved for							

purchase or donation, it must be made available for public review on the school district's website for at least 30 days. In addition, school boards must approve all library materials proposed for acquisition after the 30 day review.

Background Information:

Texas Senate Bill 13, from the 89th Legislature, was developed to increase parental control over school library materials, aiming to ensure materials align with community values by prohibiting "harmful" content and providing parents access to catalogs and a process for challenges. It was driven by a broader conservative push to implement cultural mandates in public education, giving parents the right to notice when their child gets library books.
