

School leaders can easily access extensive, quality information on why professional learning communities (PLCs) are so effective and what the PLC framework looks like. The missing link in the available resources, however, is how to implement the PLC approach in a real live school. This workshop takes a chronological journey through one school's implementation of PLC philosophy and processes, diving into lessons learned and the various pitfalls along the way. The primary thesis of the workshop is that implementing PLCs in a school is very difficult, but successful implementation is indeed possible if leaders take a phased approach. By introducing PLC elements one at a time in a logical sequence, school leaders can successfully transform schools into high functioning PLC organizations. This workshop will include numerous tips, warnings, and resources specifically focused on professional learning communities implementation.
