McMath of one seven schools named a Texas School to Watch

The Texas Middle Schools Association recently named Denton Independent School District's McMath Middle School as one of just seven Texas Schools to Watch for 2015-16, bestowing the prestigious honor for the school's academic excellence.

District students grab 36 top-10 finishes at State German Contest

Denton ISD students accounted for 36 top-10 finishes and Denton High School a seventh-place team showing at the 34th annual Texas State German Contest that was held at Texas State University in San Marcos in February.

The Texas State German Contest brings hundreds of students from across the state in a variety of academic and cultural categories highlighting the German language and culture. The state competition allows German Club students and sponsors to share what they've learned throughout the year in a fun and festive atmosphere, while providing scholarship opportunities for students and grant opportunities for teachers.

Denton High grabbed the bulk of the accolades with nine students claiming one win and 34 top 10 finishes. The school's winners included:
