Dear Parents,

Our next PBIS event is being planned and it is going to be a wonderful day for kids! Our site council has been working on our event for Tuesday, June 4th. The theme of this event is a field day. As our year begins to draw to a close, I want to thank each of you for taking the time to read this message. Your child's education is so important and sometimes this is our only means of communicating a variety of important information to each of you!

Clothing reminders:

As our weather warms up, please remind your child about appropriate school dress:

No spaghetti or bra straps or tank tops with low cut necks or under arms.

No backless or bare midriff tops. Belly buttons should not show. Pants also need to be cut high enough for modesty both in the front and back. No flip flops or other strapless shoes. Shoes need to have a strap around the back of the foot as well as

across the top in order to protect feet. Closed toes are best for playground safety. Girls should also avoid wearing high heels. Those should be saved for special events only such as Moving On or a field trip to the theatre.

Students who have inappropriate shoes may not be allowed to participate in outside recesses or other P.E. type activities for their safety.

Shorts should be fingertip length or longer.

No see through fabrics or those with multiple holes unless another shirt is underneath for modesty.

No Clothes with large or gaping holes that expose skin.

Student Behavior

Don't forget that student behavior tends to change in ways that aren't always positive as the weather warms and the end of the year nears. It is important that you follow up on any concerns voiced by the teacher, the bus driver, or the office. We want each child to make safe and appropriate choices while at school or on the bus right up to the end! We appreciate your efforts to help us with that issue. Some students who have repeated or serious referrals will not be allowed to attend field trips or participate in other fun events.

Jerome Prairie/Madrona Consolidation

Dear Parents,

As most of you know, due to declining enrollment and continued loss of funding for our district, the board voted on April 15th to close Jerome Prairie School. Many of you are probably wondering,... What does this mean to Madrona School? It means that next year we will become a larger school. Currently we have about 225 students. Next year there will be between 360 and 380 students here at Madrona. Madrona once housed over 400 students. At that time there were portable classrooms on the campus. Next year we will have three extra classrooms on our campus. Our district is working hard with us to provide those classrooms and have them ready for the opening of school on Tuesday, September 3rd. Joining our two schools, while very difficult for the Jerome Prairie families, will over time provide some advantages to all of our students. Many of you know that in the last several years we have had many blended classrooms. We are hoping that we will have only one or two blends in our school. Currently between Jerome Prairie and Madrona we have four blends. We will also have two computer labs. This will make access to learning and using technology more available to our K-2 students. We will also have two teaching positions, the kindergarten and our special needs teacher who will no longer be on an every other day schedule. They will be full time. This will also be the case with me. I will once more be a full time principal for Madrona Elementary only. With these three positions full time students, parents and staff will have full access and benefit from contact with these teachers and the principal. We will also have a full time Title One teacher for the first time in over nine years. This will allow us to provide more intervention opportunities for our students.

Some things we need to do as a school include, welcoming Jerome Prairie into our school community. You might wonder, How can I help? You can help by being available to partner with them as they begin to know about our school. During the last week of summer prior to school opening we will host a fun hour and a half activity for JP and Md families to visit our school and see what is new for students. It is tentatively set for August 29th. More info will come home regarding that. Our annual registration day will be on August 13th from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Classroom teacher assignments will be given out at that time. Thanks to everyone for helping our neighbors and new families to be informed and welcomed!


