2nd meeting of the month Program/Department Updates

Community Education

- Summer programming kicked off in mid-May with over 280 program offerings and 2500 participants enrolled. For updated information and additional program offerings, check out our new Facebook page at Red Wing Community Education
- The Juneteenth Celebration will take place on Wednesday, June 19 in Central Park. Events include a basketball tournament at 11:00am at the YMCA, Historical walks and the Slavery Exhibit at Red Wing Public Library at 1:00pm, and from 3:00-7:00pm in Central Park you will enjoy free food, haircuts, music and a variety of vendors. The Black Student Union (BSU) and a variety of community members are hosting this special event. Community Education is Fiscal Sponsor for the event.
- Red Wing Water Park opened for the season on Wednesday, June 5 and unfortunately closed on Friday, June 7th due to potentially flooding. The Water Park was able to reopen on Monday, June 10. The Water Park operates daily from 12 noon- 6:00pm.
- Summer Kids Junction began on Monday, June 3 at 6:00am with a variety of activities and action-packed field trips. Currently, 345 children are registered with a waiting list. The program will operate for 13 weeks, Monday-Friday, 6:00am-6:00pm at Sunnyside Elementary School.

Student Nutrition Services

- Summer Meals are in full Swing. We opened on Monday June 3rd at our Sunnyside location. We are offering free summer meals to anyone under the age of 18. I have attached a Flyer of the days and times we are open at our Sunnyside and Red Wing High School locations.
- We have 2 new job postings for Nutrition Services: 3-hour position at Twin Bluff Middle School and the other at Colvill for a 6-hour position
- We are in the final stages of our Freezer/Cooler project at Sunnyside Elementary. We hope to have it up and running in the next few weeks.

- 2024-2025 school year hiring continues so far, we have hired 7 certified staff and 4 non-certified staff. This leaves 13 certified openings and 10 non-certified opens as of 6/11/24.
- Setting up all end of year resignations/retirements in Alerus for COBRA/Retiree insurance options.
- Continue to assist the Business office with reporting for retirees, wellness data and requests training our Accountant, Rhonda on them.
- Updating license spreadsheets for SY24-25.
- Training in our new Sr. HR Generalist Kelsie, starts 6/20/24.
- Working with universities to place student teacher candidates for Fall 2024

Communication

- Two training days June 11-12 in Rochester in crisis reunification. Concentrated follow-up coming this summer.
- The Big 9 communications people. This year's event focused on artificial intelligence.

Buildings & Grounds

- Working with contractor for carpet replacement schedule for summer
- Working on timeline for Freezer/Cooler replacement this spring Reviewing Arena Manager/Grounds Manager responsibilities between B&G Director and Community ED
- The district conducted 350-plus radon tests in February. Only one room throughout the entire district had results above the Minnesota
- Department of Health's action level. Staff determined that an HVAC override was limiting the amount of outdoor air entering that room. MDH requires that radon testing occur between Nov. 1 and March 31. We are confident that when we retest in November that results in that space will be below the MDH limit. The space is not a classroom.

Special Services

- The special education team is actively interviewing for their open paraprofessional and teaching positions.
- Special education staff from Sunnyside, Burnside, and Twin Bluff are scheduled to attend the August STAR training. This program provides a framework for teachers so that they can teach students the skills they need to make growth in a school setting.
- Special education teachers and paraprofessionals have registered for the required Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) training offered through GCED

Athletics

- 4 RWHS athletes competed in their respective state meets in Girls Golf, Girls Track and Field, and Boys Track and Field.
- In conjunction with Community Ed, hundreds of students are engaged with summer programming throughout our community.
