Structure of Behavior Academies

Ongoing Sessions

Every ongoing behavior academy session is divided into three parts.

- 1. Check-in and progress monitoring (five minutes)
- 2. Targeted lesson and skill rehearsal (ten to fifteen minutes)
- 3. Commitment and practice (five minutes)





Exit Session

Exit requirement (that is, exit interview, project, exam, and so on)

Postskills assessment and goal mastery

Commitment for ongoing success



Check-In Check-Out Behavior Academy

Behavior Academy Description		Entrance Criteria	
Check-In Check-Out Academy	Designed for students struggling with repeated minor classroom misbehaviors	The student demonstrates repeated minor behavior challenges within the classroom (for example, disruptions, blurting out, difficulty staying on task and so on). The student has three or more classroom-based discipline write-ups, referrals, or reports within a two week period. An administrator or support provider recommends the academy.	



Exit Criteria

The student is consistently applying the learned skills.

The student has zero discipline write-ups, referrals, or reports for behavior challenges within the classroom for a sixto eight- week period.

The student meets CICO point card goals consistently for a six- to eight-week period.

An administrator or support provider improved progress ratings.
