5.3. PL974/Indian Education Kendall Rosario

The presentation Kendall Rosario shared can be found on the CTUIR website under youth services. She introduced herself as the Title VI Youth Services Manager and named the staff at each building and the surrounding districts. 8. Reports & Discussion

8.1. Nixyaawii Community School Report Ryan Heinrich

Due to Ryan Heinrich not being able to be at tonight's meeting, his report is being moved to the December regular board meeting.

8.2. Native American Equity Report Matt Yoshioka

As part of the Impact Aid policy, Pendleton School District reports key areas where perhaps our Native American students are not given the same opportunities as other students. It is important to note that this is data, not judgment. It does not provide an explanation as to why a course has a low percentage of Native

American students, or, conversely, why a particular class has a high percentage of Native American students. The Pendleton School District uses this information to ask more questions and work to remove any existing barriers that may or may not be limiting student access or success in a particular course or category of courses. Mr. Yoshioka reviewed the Semester 1 data report, which includes AP Courses, Dual Credit & Honors Courses, CTE Courses, and Other Indicator Courses.

8.3. TAPP Report Matt Yoshioka

The Tribal Attendance Promising Practices (TAPP) Grant came out of a 2013 study comparing Native American student attendance with that of all other students. 33% of all American Indian/Alaskan Native students are chronically absent (missing 10% or more of a school year) as compared to all other students, who are chronically absent at a 19% rate. Mr. Yoshioka shared the purpose, attendance strategies, and other details on how it is working in our district.

9. Board Business – Action Items

9.1. Superintendent Michelle Jensen

9.1.1. Policy – Second Reading and Adoption

OSBA recommends/requires that the following policy be adopted by the school board.

• DDB – Native American Impact Aid Funds

Director Gregg motioned to approve the above-listed policy as presented. Director Keeler seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

9.1.2. 2025 OSBA Elections Board Chair

The Oregon School Board Association (OSBA) is organized as one general state association with up to 24 regionally elected representatives established across 14 geographic regions to support member participation and representation. In odd-numbered years, an election is held for the even-numbered positions on the OSBA Board of Directors.

9.1.2.1. Board of Directors Position 2

Director Keeler moved to elect Nichole Schott, Condon SD, for Position 2 (Gorge Region) with the OSBA Board of Directors and submit the official ballot by December 15, 2025. Director Gregg seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

9.1.2.2. Legislative Policy Committee Position 2

Chari Harrison moved to elect Jose Aparicio, North Wasco County SD 21, for Position 2 (Gorge Region) with the OSBA Legislative Policy Committee and submit the official ballot by December 15, 2025. Director Pace seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

10. Board Member Comments Board Chair

Director Keeler gave a detailed report of her visit to Pendleton High School and the CTE programs at Hawthorne. Super impressed with Tim Foster and Wes Armstrong at Hawthorne, saying they are the true embodiment of the motto 'every student, every day.'

Chair Harrison attended a Hawthorne graduation in the past, and Hawthorne is life-changing for the students. She also thanked Jaimie Crane and Kendall Rosario for hosting, and looks forward to celebrating the Native American students in December.
