Homedale High School will be participating in the sixth annual Sources of Strength Suicide prevention program during the 2019-20 school year. Mrs. Debbie Flaming is a state certified trainer for Sources of Strength the S.P.A.N. Idaho (Suicide Prevention Action Network) and will be conducting a training at the high school October 2nd. The goal of the training is to encourage students and staff to be involved in campaigns to spread messages of HOPE, HELP and STRENGTH. Club advisors, coaches and teachers leading extra-curricular programs will nominate students to serve as Sources of Strength Senators to represent their group. S.O.S. Senators will be responsible to report back to their particular group about upcoming campaigns and other themes and activities planned during peer leadership meetings. The newly elected student body and class officers will also participate in Sources of Strength leadership program this year. The first planned S.O.S. event will be a half day "Booster" training on Wednesday



October 2nd. The event is hosted at Homedale High School and students will be excused from periods 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> to participate in the training. A tentative field trip is planned for Wednesday September 25<sup>th</sup> to the Risky Behaviors Symposium at Cossa for the day.

Fee Waivers are available for the cost of the test. The test will be proctored at Homedale High School. Arrival time: is between 7:30 & 7:45 a.m. Students are to bring two #2 pencils, an approved calculator, a photo ID. ACT test prep has been planned during advisory classes.
