## GRADE POINT AVERAGE CALCULATION/CLASS RANK

Grade point averages shall be calculated by averaging semester grades earned in grades 9-12 and any high school course taken prior to ninth grade for which a student earned state graduation credit according the scale below. Beginning with students entering the ninth grade during the 2005-2006 school year, grade points shall be assigned according to the level of the course. The level of courses shall be:

- 1. Advanced Placement (AP): Courses are nationally/internationally recognized for their advanced level of curriculum. Students may have the potential to earn college credit for these courses.
- 2. Pre-AP: Courses are those in which the state-mandated curriculum is extended and enriched, resulting in an academically rigorous curriculum in preparation for participating in an AP course.
- 3. Academic: Courses are those that provide a challenging curriculum in a variety of offerings based on state-mandated curriculum and aligned with Coppell ISD curriculum standards.
- 4. Basic: Courses are those that are awarded local credit and courses in which curriculum is based on a modification of state course requirements.

Courses excluded from grade point calculations are: band, PE, chorale music, driver education, office aide, counselor aide, athletics, drill team, cheerleading, and any local credit courses.

The following courses shall also be excluded from grade point calculations:

- o correspondence courses
- o online courses
- o credit by exam (with or without prior instruction)
- o dual credit courses
- o summer school courses
- o courses awarded credit by non-accredited institutions.

All students shall be included in computing class rank using grade point average calculations.
