I am requesting that a **presentation item** of the SB 12 Body Grant Armor Grant be included in the board meeting agenda for September 11, 2018.

In response to the July 7th, 2016 shooting of police officers in Dallas, Texas, Senate Bill 12 was passed during the 85th Legislature Regular Session. On May 27th, 2017 Governor Abbott signed Senate Bill 12 into law which authorized the Criminal Justice Division (CJD) of the Governor's Office to create a grant program to assist agencies in the purchase of rifle-resistant body armor.

On January 25, 2018, the Eagle Pass Independent School District was awarded a grant to equip the 29 police officers that make up our police force. We received the body armor equipment on Thursday, September 6, 2018.
